1.1.1 a) Speaking as a Language Skill

Language is an important and integral part of speaking. The words must suit the occasion and audience. The right combination of words and gestures can inspire people to involve in action and dedicate themselves to a cause. If one can speak with confidence and passion, people will relate with him and remember him.

1.1.2 Project work in a language classroom:

We learn to speak naturally in our mother tongue but linguists have contrasting theories about the process we learn to speak in our mother tongue. However, when it comes about learning a second or a foreign language, most of the linguists agree that it is a very difficult task and it's a skill that cannot be acquired without effort. So, learning to speak in English for the non-natives of this language requires much effort and practice. Let's have a brief discussion on speaking a second/foreign language.

Speaking is the skill that makes human beings different from and superior to the species of living beings. Speaking is a complex cognitive and linguistic skill. A child learns to speak through interaction with the people around him/her in their native language. Every normal adult can speak in his/her native language without effort and this skill is a natural one. But speaking in a foreign language is not natural and it requires conscious effort throughout the whole process.

Speaking is a verbal skill that involves words and sounds. It also involves:

Meaning: connotation, denotation, grammar

Sociality, Relationship,

Affect: formal, informal, slang, turn-taking

Cultural Issues: class, ethnicity, nationality, religion, gender, dialect.

Sound Elements: how volume, pitch, pace, and nature of sound complement/contradict/replace words.

The role of speaking as performance is to transmit information before an audience. It generally incorporates public speaking. It focuses on form, accuracy, organization, and sequencing, etc. of speaking. For example, political speeches, conducting a class debate, giving a lecture, etc. use speaking as performance.

Project-based learning (PBL) is a powerful teaching method that has extensive benefits for students, ranging from critical thinking to project management to self-confidence. According to research conducted by The Autodesk Foundation, studies have shown that project-based learning is linked to significant improvements in student test scores, attendance and classroom engagement. It also gives teachers the opportunity to build stronger relationships with their students by acting as their hands-on learning facilitator. In essence, PBL is an instructional method where students collaborate with others and “learn by doing.” The same skills learned through PBL are also many of the skills sought by employers.

1.1.4 Benefits to learners:

The learners are benefitted to a great extent. They can develop various skills that are useful for future. These include deeper engagement, problem solving skill, power of thinking, time management.

Collaboration:

Relationships formed during collaboration is a huge part of PBL. Not only do students learn how to work better in groups—providing their own input, listening to others, and resolving conflicts when they arise—they build positive relationships with teachers, which reinforces how great learning is. Students also form relationships with community members when working on projects, gaining insight for careers and beyond.

Problem Solving:

Students learn how to solve problems that are important to them, including real community issues, more effectively—even learning from failure and possibly starting over.

Creativity:

Students apply creative thinking skills to innovate new product designs and possibilities for projects.

In-Depth Understanding: Students build on their research skills and deepen their learning of applied content beyond facts or memorization.

Self-Confidence:

Students find their voice and learn to take pride in their work, boosting their agency and purpose.

Critical Thinking:

Students learn to look at problems with a critical thinking lens, asking questions and coming up with possible solutions for their project.

Perseverance:

When working on a project, students learn to manage obstacles more effectively, often learning from failure and making adjustments until they're satisfied with their work.

Project Management:

Students learn how to manage projects and assignments more efficiently.

Curiosity:

Students get to explore their curiosities, ask questions and form a new love for learning.

Empowerment:

Students take ownership over their projects, reflecting on and celebrating their progress and accomplishments.

1.1.5 The role of a teacher:

A teacher plays a pivotal role in implementing a project. He is a guiding star. He instills courage in them, explains its benefits that can lead them to a better future. He is the resource provider and mentor.

Designer: The ISTE Standards emphasize the teacher's role as designer of authentic learning experiences that address content standards.

In the PBT framework, two teaching practices support this goal: design and plan is about the decisions teachers make before students launch into a project, from choosing an authentic focus for inquiry to anticipating what students might make or do to demonstrate their understanding.

Skilled PBL designers allow for flexibility in their plans to make adjustments as a project unfolds. Considerations about technology integration, outside experts and potential audiences also come into play as part of project design. Throughout a project, teachers align to standards by connecting activities and assessment to learning targets. Project-based teachers make sure that students understand what the learning goals are and why they matter.

Facilitator: The ISTE Standards call on teachers to facilitate learning with technology to support student achievement. Several PBT practices bring more detail to the role of teacher as facilitator.

Build the culture is paramount for the success of PBL experiences that are student-centered and inquiry-driven. Part of culture-building is an emphasis on excellence and the use of peer critique (along with revision based on feedback) to get to great results.

It takes time to engage students in creating shared norms and setting personal goals. Culture-building doesn't happen just at the start of the school year or launch of a project; it's ongoing, involving both teacher and students.

Manage activities is another PBT practice that supports effective facilitation. To improve their project management skills, teachers can focus on strategies for improving teamwork, time management and integrating tools for inquiry and creativity.

Engage and coach, yet another PBT practice, emphasizes the teaching moves that help students take risks, persist through challenges and celebrate successes.

Collaborator: The ISTE Standards emphasize collaboration with teaching colleagues as well as between teachers and students. Similarly, several of the PBT practices emphasize strategies for collaboration.

When teachers design and plan, for example, they improve projects by inviting feedback from colleagues (and sometimes from students, as well). In fact, many project-based teachers use the same protocols for peer critique with colleagues that they use with their students.







What is Speaking as a Language Skill

WHAT ARE SPEAKING SKILLS?

People believe that effective speaking is a natural talent. Either you have it or you don't. But this is not true. You can learn different types of speaking skills and become good at it. You can't take speaking skills lightly, no matter how talented you are. If you speak with conviction and passion, it will help the audience relate to you, believe in you, and remember you. The question then is: what are speaking skills? They are techniques that enable a speaker to convey a message effectively.

Speaking skills don't just involve the use of the right words. Your body language also has a major role in conveying a message.

THERE ARE THREE MAIN ASPECTS OF EFFECTIVE SPEAKING:

- **VOCABULARY**

Language is an integral part of speaking skills. The words you use must suit the occasion and the audience. For example, the language you use when speaking to a friend is different from the one you use for a formal presentation.

Effective speakers customize their message to suit their audience. The audience is familiar with certain types of words. It's important to use such words to get them to respond. For example, using industry terms in a client meeting can evoke desired responses.

As a general rule, shorter and simpler sentences work well. They are easier to process and understand, and they create a sense of urgency. Similarly, the memorable line in Jawaharlal Nehru's Independence Day speech in August 1947, "At the stroke of the midnight hour", conveyed the gravity of the occasion, which a line like "At 12.00 am..." may not have.

- **VOICE**

Another aspect of speaking skills in communication that is often ignored is your voice. It includes pitch, tone, and strength. How you speak signals your emotional state.

A low voice and too many pauses could denote hesitation. Clarity and volume could denote confidence. A strong and confident tone portrays conviction. People believe what you say when you deliver it in a strong voice.

Public speaking requires practice. You might be quite comfortable talking to small groups or in informal settings. But that is not the same as addressing a large crowd, which is why practice and rehearsals matter.

- **NONVERBAL**





Formal language is important as it helps us to make a good impression on people and communicate politely.

1.1.1.b Good and bad effects of project:-

1.1.2 Project work in a language classroom:-

Project work captures better than any other activity the two principal elements of a communicative approach. These are a concern for motivation, that is, how the learners relate to the task; and a concern for relevance, that is, how the learners relate to the language. We could add to these a third element: a concern for educational values, that is, how the language curriculum relates to the general educational development of the learner. Let's look at these elements in a bit more detail.

Motivation

Positive motivation is the key to successful language learning and project work is particularly useful as a means of generating this positive motivation. Why is this so? There are three reasons. First, project work is very personal. The students are writing about their own lives; they are being given the opportunity to tell the world about themselves. Second, project work is a very active medium. Students aren't just receiving and producing words; project work is "learning through doing." Last, project work gives a clear sense of achievement. It enables all students to produce a worthwhile product.

Relevance

A foreign language can often seem a remote and unreal thing. This inevitably has a negative effect on motivation, because the students don't see the language as relevant to their own lives. If learners are going to become real language users, they must learn that English can be used to talk about their own world.

Project work helps to bridge this relevance gap in three ways. First, project work helps to integrate the foreign language into the network of the learner's own communicative competence. Second, project work helps to make the language more relevant to learners' actual needs, because they are learning how to communicate about their own world – about their house, their family, their town, and so forth. Third, project work establishes a sounder relationship between language and culture. With project work the language acts as a bridge, enabling two cultures to communicate with each other.

Education

There is a growing awareness among language teachers that the process and content of the language class should contribute towards the general educational development of the learner. Project work encourages initiative, independence, imagination, self-discipline and co-operation together with cross-curricular skills development where knowledge gained in other subjects may be used in the English class.

Practical Implications

Project work thus brings considerable benefits to the language classroom, but it is important to be aware of the implications of this way of working.

Noise – Teachers are often afraid that the project classroom will be noisier than the traditional classroom. But project work does not have to be noisier than any other activity. Remember that the traditional classroom has quite a lot of noise in it, too. There is usually at least one person talking (and teachers usually talk rather loudly!) and there may be a tape recorder playing, possibly with the whole class doing a drill. There is no reason why project work should be any noisier than forty students giving a choral response – quite the opposite, in fact.

Time – It takes longer to prepare, make and present a project than it does to do more traditional activities. But two points are worth bearing in mind. First, not all project work needs to be done

in class time. Projects about “Your lifestyle,” for example, can be done at home. Second, when choosing to do project work, you need to recognize that you are making a philosophical choice in favour of the quality of the learning experience over the quantity of time required. Project work provides rich learning experiences – rich in colour, movement, interaction and, most of all, involvement.

1.1.3 The advantages of project work:-

Project-based learning (PBL) is a powerful teaching method that has extensive benefits for students, ranging from critical thinking to project management to self-confidence. Some benefits of project work are-

Problem Solving: Students learn how to solve problems that are important to them, including real community issues, more effectively—even learning from failure and possibly starting over.

Creativity: Students apply creative thinking skills to innovate new product designs and possibilities for projects.

In-Depth Understanding: Students build on their research skills and deepen their learning of applied content beyond facts or memorization.

Self-Confidence: Students find their voice and learn to take pride in their work, boosting their agency and purpose.

Critical Thinking: Students learn to look at problems with a critical thinking lens, asking questions and coming up with possible solutions for their project.

Perseverance: When working on a project, students learn to manage obstacles more effectively, often learning from failure and making adjustments until they’re satisfied with their work.

Project Management: Students learn how to manage projects and assignments more efficiently.

4. TRANSFORMATIVE CONFIDENCE

Finally, project-based learning benefits students by instilling them with confidence to take appropriate, educational risks, resulting in greater academic success. Moreover, this confidence permeates other areas of life so that curious students mature into curious adults with a lifelong love of learning.

About Project Work

Example A group of teenage learners work on a project to develop a series of posters on how to protect the environment. In the classroom Project work may provide many opportunities to meet a variety of learning aims but it requires strong classroom management skills. Learners need independence in planning and realizing the work but they also need the teacher to act as a driver in ensuring it is carried out in a way that meets learning aims.

Pedagogical references of project work in past

*John Dewey is recognized as one of the early proponents of project-based education or at least its principles through his idea of "learning by doing". In *My Pedagogical Creed* (1897) Dewey enumerated his beliefs including the view that "the teacher is not in the school to impose certain ideas or to form certain habits in the child, but is there as a member of the community to select the influences which shall affect the child and to assist him in properly responding to these. For this reason, he promoted the so-called expressive or constructive activities as the centre of correlation. Educational research has advanced this idea of teaching and learning into a methodology known as "project-based learning". William Heard Kilpatrick built on the theory of Dewey, who was his teacher, and introduced the project method as a component of Dewey's problem method of teaching. Some scholars (e.g. James G. Greene) also associated project-based learning with Jean Piaget's "situated learning" perspective and constructivist theories. Piaget advocated an idea of learning that does not focus on the memorization. Within his theory, project-based learning is considered a method that engages students to invent and to view learning as a process with a future instead of acquiring knowledge base as a matter of fact. Further developments to the project-based education as a pedagogy later drew from the experience- and perception-based theories on education proposed by theorists such as Jan Comenius, Johann Heinrich Pestalozzi, and Maria Montessori, among others.*

What is Speaking?

Speaking is the skill that makes human beings different from and superior to the species of living beings. Speaking is a complex cognitive and linguistic skill. A child learns to speak through interaction with the people around him

Functions of Speaking:

There are a lot of functions of speaking in human lives every day. However, these functions can be divided into three main categories.

Interaction

Transaction

Performance

Speaking as Interaction

The role of speaking as interaction is mostly of a social conversation. It reflects the roles and the relationships of the speaker in a social setting. For example, chatting to a fellow passenger, telling a friend about an amusing experience, etc. are the interaction that we conduct through speaking.

Speaking as Transaction

The role of speaking as transaction is to make someone understood the message that we want to give to him

Speaking as Performance

The role of speaking as performance is to transmit information before an audience. It generally incorporates public speaking. It focuses on form, accuracy, organization, and sequencing, etc. of speaking. For example, political speeches, conducting a class debate, giving a lecture, etc. use speaking as performance.

Types Of Speaking Skills And Frameworks

While speaking effectively is rewarding, it is also challenging. Various speaking skills and frameworks can help overcome the challenges.

Aristotle's Appeals

One of the most useful frameworks speakers use is Aristotle's Appeals. They help you find various ways to appeal to the audience. Your appeal can be based on logic, authority, and emotion. The audience might listen to you because your argument makes sense. They might listen because you've appealed to their anger or sadness or some other emotion. They could also listen to you because you're an expert. These different types of appeals are also known as Logos, Ethos, and Pathos.

The PAM Framework

Another useful framework is PAM (Purpose, Audience, and Message). You convey the purpose or objective of your speech to the audience through a verbal message. The PAM framework requires you to know your audience, their triggers, likes, and dislikes.

THE THREE W'S

You can also use an introspective framework. This is where The Three W's of speaking will come to your aid. The first 'W' is 'Why are you delivering this speech?' The second is 'Who is listening?' And the third 'What are you talking about?' Together these questions help you define your purpose and your audience. The third question helps you structure your speech. The importance of speaking effectively lies in its tremendous potential to induce change.

A good speech can inspire employees and even save companies. Their words may fade over time, but the feeling they leave us with never diminishes. In the words of American poet Maya Angelou, "I've learned that people will forget what you said, people will forget what you did, but people will never forget how you made them feel."

There Are Three Main Aspects Of Effective

Speaking:

Vocabulary

Language is an integral part of speaking skills. The words you use must suit the occasion and the audience. For example, the language you use when speaking to a friend is different from the one you use for a formal presentation. Effective speakers customize their message to suit their audience. The audience is familiar with certain types of words. It's important to use such words to get them to respond. For example, using industry terms in a client meeting can evoke desired responses. As a general rule, shorter and simpler sentences work well. They are easier to process and understand, and they create a sense of urgency. For example, in the Avengers series of movies, when Captain America says, "Avengers assemble!", and not "Avengers, gather around me", the message becomes memorable and impactful. Similarly, the memorable line in Jawaharlal Nehru's Independence Day speech in August 1947, "At the stroke of the midnight hour", conveyed the gravity of the occasion, which a line like "At 12.00 am..." may not have.

Voice

Another aspect of speaking skills in communication that is often ignored is your voice. It includes pitch, tone, and strength. How you speak signals your emotional state. A low voice and too many pauses could denote hesitation. Clarity and volume could denote confidence. A strong and confident tone portrays conviction. People believe what you say when you deliver it in a strong voice. Public speaking requires practice. You might be quite comfortable talking to small groups or in informal settings. But that is not the same as addressing a large crowd, which is why practice and rehearsals matter. You can slowly read your message aloud, making sure you pause at the appropriate places. This will help you polish your speaking style. Good orators have a tone and style which they own. It's his distinctive voice that makes Morgan Freeman a favorite Hollywood narrator.

Nonverbal

The final aspect of speaking skills is not about speaking at all. Non-verbal communication consists of body language. It includes facial expression, posture, eye contact, and hand gestures. Your body language must match your words for your address to be effective. Your body language signals to the audience how invested you are into what you are speaking about. It shows the passion behind your words and helps draw the audience emotionally to your message and make them feel involved.






1.1.1. Pedagogical references of project work

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Introduction

Communication skills are the abilities you use when giving and receiving different kinds of information. Some examples include communicating new ideas, feelings or even an update on your project. Communication skills involve listening, speaking, observing and empathizing. Four main parts of language skills are:

- Listening
- Speaking
- Reading
- Writing

Speaking is the second step of language skill. It is a complex process which correlates to mental aspect with the help of listening source. Speaking is the primary way in which we communicate information.

Speaking postures and speaking style are the two most important factors in the process of speaking. While we speak, our speaking postures like the way of holding book, speaking gestures, our expressions etc. creates an impact on the mind of the listeners. In the same way speaking styles like word pronunciation, word expressions, speed of speaking and pausing, way of speaking, are some of the significant points to be kept in mind while we speak.

In text projects, the pupils work with various materials, like literature texts, newspapers and magazines, video and audio materials and etc. Class correspondence projects combines encounter with native speakers and work with written and visual materials, such as letters, audio letters, video letters and photo stories

- Perseverance: When working on a project, students learn to manage obstacles more effectively, often learning from failure and making adjustments until they're satisfied with their work.
- Project Management: Students learn how to manage projects and assignments more efficiently.
- Curiosity: Students get to explore their curiosities, ask questions and form a new love for learning.
- Empowerment: Students take ownership over their projects, reflecting on and celebrating their progress and accomplishments.

- He also helps the students in evaluating the project and to draw inferences.
- The relation of the teacher with his students is very closer in project method than in the ordinary class teaching.
- The teacher is like a friend, an elder brother who works together with the students and helps them to gain rich experiences.
- He acts in the capacity of a director of the student group and gives all types of necessary directions and does not behave as an autocratic teacher.

Stages of a project

Projects are divided into six stages:

- Definition.
- Initiation.
- Planning.
- Execution.
- Monitoring & Control.
- Closure.

Each project stage is characterized by a distinct set of activities that take the project from the first idea to its conclusion. Each stage is of equal importance and contributes to the overall success of the project.

- 1) Definition: Before a project starts the project manager must make sure the project goals, objectives, scope, risks, issues, budget, timescale and approach have been defined. This must be communicated to all the stakeholders to get their agreement. Any differences of opinion must be resolved before work starts.
- 2) Initiation: This is perhaps the most important stage of any project as it sets the terms of reference within which the project will be run. If this is not done well, the project will have a high probability of failure. The initiation stage is where the business case is declared, scope of the project decided and stakeholder expectations set. Time spent on planning, refining the business case and communicating the expected benefits will help improve the probability of success. It is tempting to start work quickly, but a poor initiation stage often leads to problems and even failure.
- 3) Planning: The key to a successful project is in the planning. Creating a project plan is the first task you should do when undertaking any project. Often project planning is ignored in favor of getting on with the work. However, many people fail to realize the value of a project plan in saving time, money and for avoiding many other problems.
- 4) Execution: This is where the work to deliver the product, service or wanted result is carried out. Most of the work related to the project is realized at this stage and needs complete attention from the project manager.
- 5) Monitoring & Control: Once the project is running it is important the project manager keeps control. This is achieved by regular reporting of issues, risks,

progress and the constant checking of the business case to make sure that the expected benefits will be delivered and are still valid.

- 6) Closure: Often neglected, it is important to make sure the project is closed properly. Many projects do not have a clear end-point because there is no formal sign-off. It is important to get the customers' agreement that the project has ended, and no more work will be carried out. Once closed, the project manager should review the project and record the good and bad points, so that in the future, successes can be repeated, and failures avoided. A project that is not closed will continue to consume resources.

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

1.1 About project work

1.1.1 Pedagogical references of project work in the past

1.1.1.a What is Speaking as a Language skill?

Speaking is the action of conveying information or expressing one's feelings in speech. It is the delivery of language through the mouth. To speak we create sounds using many parts of our body including the lungs, vocal tract, vocal chords, tongue and lips.

1.1.1.b Some divisions of Speaking:-

The divisions of speaking includes the follows:-

- a) Setting and Scene:- Setting refers to the time and place of a speech act and in general to the physical circumstances. Scene is the physiological setting or cultural definition including characteristics such as range of formality and sense of play or seriousness. It also refers to implicit rules and expectations surrounding the speech event.
- b) Participants:- Participants include the speaker and the audience. According to linguist anthropologists audience is referred to those to whom the speech act is directed and who are addressed while the speaker is the one who delivers the message.
- c) Ends:- The end of the speech event are the purposes, goals and outcomes. Differences in the goals and outcomes of speech events can be frequent, especially in classrooms and work spaces.
- d) Act sequences:- Act sequence refers to the sequence of speech acts that make up the event. The order of speech acts greatly influences the speech events. It

also orients the participants to social cues. Important aspects of act sequence include turn taking and interrupting.

- e) Key:- Key refers to the clues that establish the tone, manner or spirit of the speech act. Generally, different keys are used in different situations, for instance, different tones are used at birthday parties and funerals. Intonation in sentences can provide additional meanings. Lighter tones communicate humour and friendship while monotone speech acts communicate seriousness or lack of emotions. Proper application of the appropriate key in a speech event is vital for linguistic competence.
- f) Instrumentalities:- They are the channels used to complete the speech act. These include the method of communication, the language, dialect or register (a variety of language used in specific settings). According to Hymes, instrumentalities are generally described as the forms and styles of speech.
- g) Norms:- Social rules governing the event and the participants action and reactions. Norms will vary for each speech community.
- h) Genre:- The kind of speech, act or event in a speech act is the genre. Different disciplines develop terms for kinds of speech acts and speech communities sometimes have their own terms for types. Examples of speech genres include gossip, jokes and conversations.

1.1.2 Project work in a language classroom:-

Project work is a work which focuses on completing a task and normally involves a lot of resources, time people and materials and learners practice a range of skills and language systems. In the classroom it provides many opportunities to meet a variety of learning aims which requires strong classroom management skills. 

time and he may miss the examination. Now being so much frustrated and irritated the boy sat down on the roadside and began sobbing.



What is Speaking?

In sociolinguistics, speaking or the speaking model, is a model socio-linguistic study (represented as a mnemonic) developed by Dell Hymes. Hymes developed this model as part of a new methodology referred to as the ethnography of speaking. This model is a tool to assist the identification and labelling of components of interactional linguistics that was driven by his view that, in order to speak a language correctly, one needs not only to learn its vocabulary and grammar, but also the context in which words are used. In essence, the learning the components of the speaking model is essential for linguistic competence.

Some Division of Speaking

- **Setting & Scene**

Setting refers to the time and place of a speech act and, in general, to the physical circumstances". The living room in the grandparents' home might be a setting for a family story. Scene is the "psychological setting" or "Cultural definition" of a scene, including characteristics such as range of formality and sense of play or seriousness. The family story may be told at a reunion celebrating the grandparents' anniversary. At times, the family would be festive and playful, at other times, serious and commemorative.

- **Key**

"Key" refers to the clues that establish the "tone, manner, or spirit" of the speech act. The aunt might imitate the grandmother's voice and gestures in a playful way, or she might address the group in a serious voice emphasizing the sincerity and respect of the praise the story expresses.

- **Instrumentalities**

Instrumentalities are the channels used to complete the speech act. These include the method of communication (writing, speaking, signing or signalling), the language, dialect (a mutually intelligible subset of a language) or register (a variety of a language that is used in specific settings). Hymes described these instrumentalities generally as the Forms and styles of speech. For example, the instrumentality of the spoken word is different from the written word; the language spoken is unique to the speech act, as is the dialect. Similarly, the register that is spoken influences the speech event. For example, an aunt might speak in a casual register with many dialect features, but if her niece continues the conversation in a more formal register with careful grammatically "standard" forms the conversation may seem awkward.

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

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



About Project Work

The project work at schools and colleges is used across the curriculum. Sometimes we call "project work" every activity that is different from a traditional way of teaching and learning.

According **Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary (2000)** "project" is:

1. Planned work – a planned piece of work that is designed to find information about it, to produce it new, or to improve it.
2. School/college work – a piece of work involving careful study of a subject over a period of time, done by school or college students.

The definition of "project" in **Oxford Wordpower Dictionary (2006)** is:

1. a piece of work, involving many people, that 's planned ,organized carefully,
2. a piece of school work in which the student has to collect information about a certain subject and then write about it.

In **Advanced Learner's English Dictionary**, Harper Collins Publishers, "project" is task that requires a lot of time and effort."

Cambridge Advanced learner's Dictionary (2003) defines "project" as:

1. A piece of planned work or an activity which is completed over a period. and intended to achieve a particular aim.
2. A study of a particular subject done over a period of time, especially by students.

The most detailed definition of "project" we can find in **The New Penguin English Dictionary (2000)**:

1. A specific plan or design; a scheme
2. A planned undertaking; e. g. a) a piece of research with a definite plan. b) a large or complex piece of work, esp. one involving joint effort. c) a task or problem engaged in usually by a group of a pupils, esp. to supplement and apply classroom studies.

In educational context, the project work should be pupil-centred activity, no teacher-centred or syllabus-centred one. The pupils have to understand why they make a project and how it is useful for them. The best way is when they can choose the topic of the project themselves. They usually work in groups and they develop their social skills to cooperate and communicate together. They choose the way of work, divide tasks and agree on the output of the project. As one of the most important rules of the project work I consider the fact that the pupils are responsible for their work on their project and for their results. At the end the pupils present the result of their project and the teacher evaluates not only the project itself but also the work of each pupil on the project and the cooperation among the pupils in their groups.

Pedagogical references of project work in the past

Projects and project work have become more common nowadays but they are not new ideas in education.

In Comenius writings he points out a child's personality was emphasized, a child is considered as a jewel and he draws attention to internal potential of a child and possibilities of his development. He also emphasizes advisability and benefit of the curriculum for children and as a motivation he recommends something what could interest them and capture their attention. (Comenius, sec. cit. In Kratochvílová 2009, p.24, translation by author)

We can find the roots of project work in pedagogical references of thinkers of 18th and 19th century – J. J. Rousseau, J. H. Pestalozzi, (Kratochvílová 2009, p. 24, translation by author)

J. J. Rousseau's thoughts have coherence with current conception of education.,,Rousseau points out that the method of development from childhood to adulthood is through interaction of the natural child with his environment. The child is developed through his experience, and experience is defined as everything that happens to him through his contact with his environment.“ (Stockton 1920, p. 8)

Rousseau also emphasised the individuality of a child, his effort to invent, to solve new situations, his tendency to think. Rousseau believed in a great potencial of a human being and possibility of his future development. (Kratochvílová 2009, p. 25, translation by author)

J. H. Pestalozzi was influenced by Rousseau's work, he developed Rousseau's principles of education and „was the first to get them at least partially into practise.“(Stockton, p. 11). Pestalozzi defined education as „the harmonious development of all the powers and capacities of the human being.“ (Stockton 1920, p. 12). Both Rousseau and Pestalozzi considered the child as the centre of education and they claimed that „education must be with direct reference to the natural development of the whole child,physical, mental, and moral.“ (Stockton 1920, p. 12)

What is Speaking ?

Speaking is an interactive process of constructing meaning that involves producing and receiving and processing information. Speaking is the delivery of language through the mouth. Speaking is the skill that makes human beings different from and superior to the species of living beings. Speaking is a complex cognitive and linguistic skill. To speak, we create sounds using many parts of our body, including the lungs, vocal tract, vocal chords, tongue, teeth and lips. Its form and meaning are dependent on the context in which it occurs, including the participants themselves, their collective experiences, the physical environment, and the purposes for speaking. Simply, it is the way of conversing or expressing one's thoughts in spoken language .It is often spontaneous, open-ended, and evolving. However, speech is not always unpredictable. As it may be an informal remarks whereas it may also be a scholarly presentation to a formal address.

What is speaking as a language skill?

Speaking is the second of the four language skills, which are:

1. Listening
2. Speaking
3. Reading
4. Writing

In our own language, speaking is usually the second language skill that we learn. This vocalized form of language usually requires at least one listener. When two or more people speak or talk to each other, the conversation is called a "dialogue". Speech can flow naturally from one person to another in the form of dialogue. It can also be planned and rehearsed, as in the delivery of a speech or presentation. Of course, some people talk to themselves! In fact, some English learners practise speaking standing alone in front of a mirror.

Speaking can be formal or informal:

- Informal speaking is typically used with family and friends, or people you know well.
- Formal speaking occurs in business or academic situations, or when meeting people for the first time.

Speaking is a skill that involves words and sounds. It also involves: _

- **Meaning**: connotation, denotation, grammar
- **Sociality, Relationship, Affect**: formal, informal, slang, turn-taking
- **Cultural Issues**: class, ethnicity, nationality, religion, gender, dialect
- **Performance**: articulation, projection, pronunciation
- **Sound Elements**: how volume, pitch, pace, and nature of sound complement/contradict/replace words

Functions of Speaking:

There are a lot of functions of speaking in human lives every day. However, these functions can be divided into three main categories.

- **Interaction**
- **Transaction**
- **Performance**

Speaking as Interaction

The role of speaking as interaction is mostly of a social conversation. It reflects the roles and the relationships of the speaker in a social setting. For example, chatting to a fellow passenger, telling a friend about an amusing experience, etc. are the interaction that we conduct through speaking.

Speaking as Transaction

The role of speaking as transaction is to make someone understand the message that we want to give to him/her. The focus of this type of speaking is giving and receiving information and obtaining goods/services. For example, classroom group discussions, shopping, making a telephone call, ordering food from a menu in a restaurant, etc. use speaking as transaction of information.

Speaking as Performance


The role of speaking as performance is to transmit information before an audience. It generally incorporates public speaking. It focuses on form, accuracy, organization, and sequencing, etc. of speaking. For example, political speeches, conducting a class debate, giving a lecture, etc. use speaking as performance.

The Advantages of Speaking Skills

Even if there are four other skills in the English language, speaking skills are the most effective one among them as a majority of communication is done through speech. Therefore, speaking skills are the most important method of communication. There is no doubt that proficiency in each skill is necessary to become a well-rounded communicator, but the ability to speak skillfully provides the speakers with several distinct advantages. The main advantages of speaking skills are:

- To participate actively in pair or group activities in the classrooms.
- To give a maiden and impressive speech on different occasions.
- To participate actively in debates and group discussions.
- To develop critical thinking among the learners.
- To pursue higher studies in foreign countries.
- To interact with people all around the globe.
- To promote the sale of products in the business.
- To make living abroad simpler and easier.
- To get better employment opportunities.
- To make use of the internet effectively.
- To perform well in job interviews.
- To acquire more knowledge.
- To travel to a foreign country.
- To do good international business.
- To earn high respect in the society.
- To give presentations for all purposes.
- To communicate effectively with others.
- To increase the income of the individual.
- To boost up the speakers' self-confidence.
- To know the different cultures of the world.
- To interact with people all around the globe.
- To keep over cognition and reasoning very sharp.
- To get better employment opportunities all over the world.
- To increase the ability of problem-solving and critical thinking.
- To improve the overall development of the speaker's personality.
- To highly motivate and attract the customers in buying the products.

Key points for development of speaking skills



Remember, when speaking English...

Try to become less hesitant and more confident.

Don't be shy to speak – the more you do it, the more confident you'll become.

Remember to be polite – use **"please"** and **"thank you"** if you ask someone to do something for you.

Project work in a language classroom

Project work in the language classroom is the opportunity for learners to develop their language skills, it encourages learners to use the foreign language and motivates them. Moreover, it develops the learners' social skills, the ability to cooperate together, because they often work in groups on their project, and their sense for responsibility for their work.

In the context of language learning, projects are multi-skill activities focusing on topics or themes rather than on specific language targets. Thus the learners concentrate on reaching the targets, with opportunities to recycle known language and skills in a relatively natural context.

Once said *“most organized language learning takes place in the classroom. What is taught in the classroom may in theory be useful, but usefulness does not always extend to practice. Often, there is a gap between the language the students are taught and the language they in fact require. It is this gap that project work can help to bridge.”*

I agree with the above quote that the pupils can use and develop all language skills especially in those projects that enable practical usage of the aim language, the exchange of personal letters, emails etc., communication "face to face" and other activities to find the reason why they should learn the foreign language. I think that it is important to persuade the pupils that they can improve their language knowledge not only by travelling abroad, but also at schools and colleges by making such activities like project works.

Hence, project works can be divided into four main categories as:

1. Information and research projects
2. Survey projects
3. Production projects
4. Performance and organisational projects

The Advantages of Project work

The projects are considered by the pupils as more enjoyable way of learning and I think these are common advantages of using project work in the lessons: to motivate the pupils to learning, to be responsible for own learning and the possibility of using taught language in a real life.

Language learning in project work in which students become responsible for their own learning. They select and devise project, with the teacher acting as coordinator. They deal with the task and language requirements emerge from the task.

A freelance writer Diana L. Fried-Booth , She also claims that *"the motivation lies in the project itself" because the learner "is offered the opportunity of using the language skills already acquired, in a situation which is new, challenging, and real."* (Fried-Booth 1986, p. 8) The project work offers not only groovy and expectable events but also unknown and unexpected situations and thereby it creates the place for development.

Advantages of project work also includes :

1. Deeper engagement and interaction with language skill content.
2. Encouragement of higher order thinking skills and problem solving.
3. Development of professional networks.
4. Fostering skills like effective communication and collaboration.
5. Sense of mastery and self-efficacy.
6. Gaining valuable life insights.
7. Engagement with task related specialised personnels.
8. Enhancement of public speaking and socializing skills.
9. Technical quality development like videography, editing, etc.
10. Nourishment of vocab and word plotting senses with script writing.

Benefit for learners

I think that the most important benefit of project work for the pupils is that it enables them the contact with real world in which they use the target language that they have learnt.

Based on my experience, I can mention other benefits of project work to the pupils:

1. They work on their own level and can achieve a goal regardless how good they are at the target language, which is very motivating for them.
2. They work with a wider range of materials than their textbook offers.
3. They improve their communicative and social skills, such as cooperating in groups and developing their personality, acting with other pupils in a group, listening to others and expressing their own opinions, stating their cases and attitudes, solving the problems and etc.
4. They deal with problems which they are interested in and they learn to solve them.
5. They are taught to be responsible for their work and its results.
6. The pupils' efforts and joining the project are more important than linguistic accuracy.
7. Projects are participatory activities – student involvement in making choices and decisions tends to increase their motivation and interest.
8. Projects cater for all abilities within a class – he argues that students of different abilities can work on tasks of equal importance and use their talents which are valuable for the success of a project.
9. Projects re-integrate language –for common teaching purposes a foreign language is divided into constituent parts like structures, functions, vocabulary, pronunciation and skills..
10. Projects establish a context which balances the need for fluency and accuracy .
11. Projects are a break with routine – as the most important benefit of project work is that it allows students to relax and think out of box for doing creative tasks.

The Role of a Teacher

Although the responsibility for project work is given to the pupils, a teacher's role is not insignificant. In the project, the teacher is acting as advisor (or consultant) and coordinator. Making a project does not mean „more work“ for the teacher if he is able to plan and organize it well and he makes the pupils to take the responsibility for the end product.

The teacher's role in project work:

1. Initiating role: the teacher decides when it is the suitable time for a project and how long it should last. Then he/she also introduces a broad discussion topic which may develop naturally into a project.

2. During the project:

a) The teacher is an advisor being prepared to advice and help if the pupils ask for it.

b) As a referee he/she is assisting to solve out arguments and differences of opinion. And warn them about hazards time to time.


c) As a chairperson, from time to time groups will report their activities to the whole class. On these occasions the teacher take on the role of an objective chairperson.

3. Finally: when the project is coming to its end, the teacher becomes an organiser being actively involved in the organization of displays, the final production of written reports, etc.“ As an evaluator, he/she encourages the pupils to evaluate the project work process for themselves“ and he/she should be prepared to comment honestly on “what the students have reached”.

The relation of the teacher with his students is very closer in project method than in usual class. The teacher is like a friend philosopher and guide who works along with the students and helps them to gain rich experiences where he/she acts as a director who gives all types of necessary directions without behaving as an autocratic leader.

Stages of Project

The success of project work depends on planning and organization that pupils and a teacher deal with together. If a good timetable of the project is established, it helps to avoid the chaos and similar problems. The following flowchart describes the stages of project as follows:



Introduction to the project

“Helping Hand”

Our project is focused on the face to face interaction between two persons. The project is presented as a short film. The short film mainly focuses on a scene of a hostel mess room of one hosteller where another comes forward to extend a hand of support in a time of necessity which ultimately showcases their communication and socialising skills along with a true essence of humanity in between.

The common topic that has been assigned to all is “Helping Hand”. Our film is named “Helping hand: A Quarantine story”. The film represents the purity of friendship between the two hostellers, who are the main characters of the film, played by Koustav De and Krishnendu Bose. A strong message is communicated by this film, that a true friend and an morally educated human never thinks before helping anyone no matter how big a problem or how much worse situation is that person going through .

The storyline revolves around two hostellers from middle class families and different states staying in a PG in Kolkata, a usual scene in the field of higher studies where one being a senior and the other being a communicable junior ready to help anytime without any hesitation .

Motivation and Registration

The main motivation of making this project (i.e. Film) is to present our speaking and communication skills to the teacher who has assigned us this project, also giving us exposure to socialise with our friends and family for taking various help in order to complete this project. To start with the project work I had to encounter and resolve various problems like managing the cast, writing the script, registering the right people to be assigned their specific tasks, engaging with the people in the line of script writing, screenplay, filming, etc. Thus in a nutshell, this project also helped us grow within ourselves in terms of coordination skills, management skills, problem resolving skills, and even leadership skills.

The Film:

“Helping Hand: A Quarantine story”

Storyline: It was July 2021, the Delta variant gave a new face to the COVID-19 pandemic “the second wave” even more dreadful than the first wave which resulted in another nationwide lockdown hampering survival of each and every classes of the society but the worst effected sections where the middle class, poors, and the students.

Now coming towards the east coast of India lied the beautiful city of joy and the heart of West Bengal , Kolkata where a mass number of students got stuck unfortunately at their respective hostels, messes, PGs who came here for higher studies from other districts and some even from other states. Likewise in the north of Kolkata, two students of completely different backgrounds one being Krishnendu Basu, a resident of Bardhaman pursuing MSc agriculture and the other , Koustav De , a resident of the North-eastern state Tripura ,10+2 passed and looking to take admission in RKMVCC in Microbiology department, were stuck at a PG in Alambazar, Baranagar due to the sudden surge of covid cases.

And one fine sunny day, Krishnendu thought of getting his room cleaned once cause it became a bit dirty so as usually he went down the stairs to bring a basket of water to for getting the floor wet-wiped but unfortunately he slipped in front of his door while entering his room on an oil spill and suffered a sprained ankle . Then he called the guy from Tripura who happened to be his junior staying in the ground floor for help. He entered and called politely, “Krishnendu da! Are you there?” and a mild – slow voice came in return “yes I’m in”. Then Koustav Rushed towards him and gave him the necessary first aid meanwhile he got to know about what actually happened and after giving a mild massage and applying volini spray , he wrapped a crepe bandage around the sprained ankle and told Krishnendu to take rest. In the mean time Koustav picked up the mop and wet wiped the room which was left undone in the heat of the moment and later waited till the floor dried . After a while Koustav , booked an appointment online with a physician who would prescribe some medicines and will give a brief look on the account of the injury.

And thus a simple and kind gesture of a hoteller towards another made one feel happy and one feel satisfied cause “ being kind isn’t the best quality , it’s justa a basic quality.



Communication, therefore, involves more than one person.

Communication is a continuous and dynamic process involving more than one person. It is a cyclic process denoting continuous flow of information. It essentially involves sender, message and recipient. The sender conceives ideas and encodes them into suitable medium (facts, figures, pictures), sends them through appropriate channel (email, phone, speech) to the recipient. The recipient decodes the message, understands it and encodes feedback and sends it to the sender.

Communication has different modes and types. There are a huge number of skills that are also involved in this simple process, which keeps us linked with our loved ones and helps us to proceed through our day to day lives. There are also different languages that are involved in communication. We even face different channels and barriers to communication.

1. Theoretical part

1.1. About project work

This project elaborates on the value of speaking as a language skill. It also shows us the importance of communication in our day to day lives. The short film on the topic “Helping Hands” elaborates on the fact that how a simple one minute communication between two individuals can be such a boon for both of them.

1.1.1. a) What is speaking as a Language Skill?

Speaking is the delivery of language through the mouth. To speak, we create sounds using many parts of our body, including the lungs, vocal tract, vocal chords, tongue, teeth and lips.

Speaking is a verbal skill that involves words and sounds. It also involves:

- Meaning: connotation, denotation, grammar
- Sociality, Relationship, Affect: formal, informal, slang, turn-taking
- Cultural Issues: class, ethnicity, nationality, religion, gender, dialect
- Performance: articulation, projection, pronunciation
- Sound Elements: how volume, pitch, pace, and nature of sound complement/contradict/replace words

b) What are the functions of speaking?

There are a lot of functions of speaking in human lives every day. However, these functions can be divided into three main categories.

- Speaking as **Interaction**: The role of speaking as interaction is mostly of a social conversation. It reflects the roles and the relationships of the speaker in a social setting. For example, chatting to a fellow passenger, telling a friend about an amusing experience, etc. are the interaction that we conduct through speaking.
- Speaking as **Transaction**: The role of speaking as transaction is to make someone understand the message that we want to give to him/her. The focus of this type of speaking is giving and receiving information and obtaining goods/services. For example, classroom group discussions, shopping, making a telephone call, ordering food from a menu in a restaurant, etc. use speaking as transaction of information.
- Speaking as **Performance**: The role of speaking as performance is to transmit information before an audience. It generally incorporates public speaking. It focuses on form, accuracy, organization, and sequencing, etc. of

speaking. For example, political speeches, conducting a class debate, giving a lecture, etc. use speaking as performance.

c) What are the micro skills in speaking?

There are some micro skills involved in speaking:

- The speaker has to pronounce the distinctive sounds of a language clearly enough such that the listener are able to distinguish between them easily enough.
- The speaker has to use the correct forms of words. This includes the correct tense, case, or gender.
- The words spoken have to put together in the correct order.
- Vocabulary should be used appropriately.
- The language used by the speaker in a conversation in a particular situation should be appropriate to the situation, and also, understandable by the listener.
- The main ideas in a conversation should be made to stand out more by the speaker than the supporting ideas.

d) What are the barriers to effective speaking and communication?

The barriers to effective speaking are as follows:

- Unclear messages from the speaker.
- Lack of consistency in the communication.
- Incomplete sentences in the communication.
- Not understanding the receiver.
- Some words can have different meanings to different listeners and thus it leads to feuds and problems in communication.
- Use of foul language and negative words in a speech.

e) What are the main aspects of speaking?

THERE ARE THREE MAIN ASPECTS OF EFFECTIVE SPEAKING:

- **VOCABULARY:** Language is an integral part of speaking skills. The words you use must suit the occasion and the audience. For example, the language you use when speaking to a friend is different from the one you use for a formal presentation.

Effective speakers customize their message to suit their audience. The audience is familiar with certain types of words. It's important to use such

words to get them to respond. For example, using industry terms in a client meeting can evoke desired responses.

As a general rule, shorter and simpler sentences work well. They are easier to process and understand, and they create a sense of urgency. For example, in the Avengers series of movies, when Captain America says, “Avengers assemble!”, and not “Avengers, gather around me”, the message becomes memorable and impactful.

Similarly, the memorable line in Jawaharlal Nehru’s Independence Day speech in August 1947, “At the stroke of the midnight hour”, conveyed the gravity of the occasion, which a line like “At 12.00 am...” may not have.

- **VOICE:** Another aspect of speaking skills in communication that is often ignored is your voice. It includes pitch, tone, and strength. How you speak signals your emotional state. A low voice and too many pauses could denote hesitation. Clarity and volume could denote confidence. A strong and confident tone portrays conviction. People believe what we say when we deliver it in a strong voice. Public speaking requires practice. We might be quite comfortable talking to small groups or in informal settings. But that is not the same as addressing a large crowd, which is why practice and rehearsals matter.

We can slowly read our message aloud, making sure we pause at the appropriate places. This will help us polish our speaking style. Good orators have a tone and style which they own. It’s his distinctive voice that makes Morgan Freeman a favorite Hollywood narrator.

- **NONVERBAL:** The final aspect of speaking skills is not about speaking at all. Non-verbal communication consists of body language. It includes facial expression, posture, eye contact, and hand gestures. Your body language must match your words for your address to be effective. Our body language signals to the audience how invested you are into what we are speaking about. It shows the passion behind our words and helps draw the audience emotionally to our message and make them feel involved.

f) The importance of speaking skills in our practical lives.

- **Getting them to say “YES”:** One of the objectives of speaking effectively is the ability to persuade: when we need our teacher to back our idea, when we want our team to work according to our wish or when our friend needs convincing to watch our favorite movie. These are all instances that require

effective speaking. The whole point of speaking skills is to be able to sway people's opinions. It's to get them to act in alignment with your goals.

- **Developing a career edge:** Being an effective speaker separates us from the corporate herd and pitches us as a valuable resource for our company. It, of course, gives us an edge over our colleagues. Effective communicators get special treatment because they are often asked to represent the company. They are the ones meeting the important clients, negotiating and closing deals, and building a reputation for the company.

For example, when you need to impress a new client, you send your best salesperson. You won't send in someone new or inexperienced. The best salesperson is almost always your best speaker.

When it's time for promotions and bonuses, speakers are rewarded first. Companies invest significantly in their training. They are the ones who get groomed for leadership posts.

- **Holistic communications development:** Speaking skills hold a special place of value. Good speakers are also good writers for they would have written several drafts of each speech.

Good speakers are also those who can connect and empathize with people. This makes them approachable and authentic. Often, people gravitate towards them for support and advice.

They are also readers, as reading helps expand the vocabulary and develop the flair for using suitable words for different situations. Thus, practicing speaking skills leads to the development of writing, listening, and reading skills too.

- **The 3 W's:** The first 'W' is 'Why are you delivering this speech?' The second is 'Who is listening?' And the third 'What are you talking about?' Together these questions help you define your purpose and your audience. The third question helps you structure your speech. 



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Introduction:

Language is a mean of thinking and transferring culture from one generation to another as well as from one nation to another. It is also a means of communication among people. Hence, many countries emphasize teaching languages other than the native language to its citizens. Speaking is one of the four language skills (reading, writing, listening and speaking). Speaking skills are one of the most important skills we learn, as they allow to communicate with others and express our thoughts and feelings. Speaking skills can be separated into formal and informal speaking skills and we use both types of speaking skills in a variety of contexts throughout life.

- Informal speaking is typically used with family and friends, or people you know well.
- Formal speaking occurs in business or academic situations, or when meeting for the first time.

1.1.2 Project work in a language classroom:

There are some stages of projects in a classroom.

1. Favourite object:

Process: Students bring in an object from home and give a speech about it. Teachers can adapt the assignment by changing its length or requiring speeches to reflect the unit's target language (i.e. isolating a verb tense, choosing a lexical set, etc).

2. Examinations:

Process: Students work in small groups to write an exam that tests target language. The teacher provides strong prompts and support during this stage, then reviews all tests. Tests are then distributed to other groups to be completed, before being graded (and discussed if necessary).

3. Editorials:

Process: Students create the sections of a typical newsletter, working in small groups to distribute labour. The class may like to decide on a topic for the newspaper or create a general publication. Sections include interviews, sports, weather, international news, opinion/editorial, travel, health, kids/families, letters to the editor, and more.

4. Host a Historian:

Process: Students will read about the history of a culture or several cultures. Following this, each student must complete assigned readings and dress up as a character from the historical period question. In a later class, there will be a "party" where students talk and act like their characters, while completing a mingle style activity chart.

1.1.3 The advantages of project work :

When students learn a language, they need to consolidate vocabulary. and grammar forms. Projects make it possible for students to use language in a meaningful way. By interacting and negotiating meaning in project work, students can improve reading, writing and speaking skills. 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IV. Introduction

Language is a mean of thinking and transferring culture from one generation to another as well as from one nation to another. It is also a means of communication among people. Hence, many countries emphasize teaching languages other than the native language to its citizens. Speaking is one of the four language skills (reading, writing, listening and speaking). It is the mean through which learners can communicate with others to achieve certain goals or to express their opinions, intentions, hopes and viewpoints. In addition, people who know a language are referred to as 'speakers' of that language. Speaking has usually been compared writing, both being considered "productive skills", as opposed to the "receptive skills" of reading and listening. Speaking also is closely related to listening as two interrelated ways of accomplishing communication. Every speaker is simultaneously a listener and every listener is at least potentially a speaker.

1. Theoretical part :

About the Project:

As a part of AECC project and speaking skill viz. communication skill learning we have performed a short film based on a given topic "helping hands". We have accomplished our project by performing a short video film to help my brother to install an application Google meet in his mobile phone. This project work is a supplement to that short film as directed by our guide teacher.

Pedagogical references of project work in the past :

Conversation is the very heart of schooling and pedagogy. In early education, oral language development is particularly significant for interactions, social relationships, and friendships, and for building a sense of belonging. This project aims to establish how educators manage oral language in preschool classrooms and how the implementation of specific approaches has more positive results than that of others. References are made to theoretical approaches of sociolinguistics and ethnography of communication.

What is Speaking as a Language Skill :

Human beings need to communicate between each other. Language is the vehicle or means through which this communication takes place. Communication is done to transfer information/messages from one point to another. We use language to receive information or to give information. We receive information through listening and reading. Therefore, listening and reading are known as receptive skills. We use speaking and writing for giving information. Speaking and writing are therefore known as productive skills. But we should remember that language skills are not usually used in isolation. A single activity may/usually require to practise two or three or sometimes all the four language skills. This we may regard as the mixed/integrated use of skills.

International Phonetic Alphabet (IPA), an alphabet developed in the 19th century to accurately represent the pronunciation of languages. One aim of the International Phonetic Alphabet (IPA) was to provide a unique symbol for each distinctive sound in a language that is, every sound, or phoneme, that serves to distinguish one word from another.

- ❖ **Process:** Students work in small groups to write an exam that tests target language. The teacher provides strong prompts and support during this stage, then reviews all tests. Tests are then distributed to other groups to be completed, before being graded (and discussed if necessary).

3. Editorials:

- ❖ **Process:** Students create the sections of a typical newsletter, working in small groups to distribute labour. The class may like to decide on a topic for the newspaper or create a general publication. Sections include interviews, sports, weather, international news, opinion/editorial, travel, health, kids/families, letters to the editor, and more.

4. Host a Historian:

- ❖ **Process:** Students will read about the history of a culture or several cultures. Following this, each student must complete assigned readings and dress up as a character from the historical period question. In a later class, there will be a "party" where students talk and act like their characters, while completing a mingle style activity chart.

The advantages of project work

When students learn a language, they need to consolidate vocabulary and grammar forms. Projects make it possible for students to use language in a meaningful way. By interacting and negotiating meaning in project work, students can improve reading, writing and speaking skills. The aim of this study was to determine the effect of project work on students' speaking skills and improvement in English language learning. For the method of the study, the students were asked to prepare projects they could choose on their free will. After being guided on how to do project work, the students were requested to present their projects orally in the classroom. The results of the project work show that project work presentations can help students improve their speaking skill.

In addition to usage of short film for entertainment purposes, its educational role has been realized. The short film provides a free field of study by its structure. Types of short films are fiction, documentary, experimental, animation, video art etc.

Hartley and Davies (1978) concluded that during verbal-based education, the university students were able to remember 70 % of what had been taught in the first 10 minutes and only 20 % of what had been taught within the last 10 minutes (Açıkgöz, 2008: 6). Özcan Demirel conducted a study on remembering. Second, project work is a very active medium. Students aren't just receiving and producing words; project work is "learning through doing." Last, project work gives a clear sense of achievement. It enables all students to produce a worthwhile product.

Relevance

A foreign language can often seem a remote and unreal thing. This inevitably has a negative effect on motivation, because the students don't see the language as relevant to their own lives.
