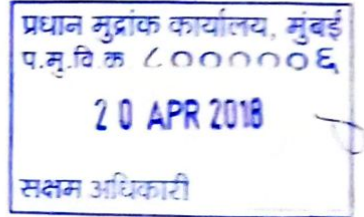

### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

*This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU) is made on 30th April 2018 between Ramkrishna Mission Vivekananda Centenary College, Rahara (Kolkata) a branch of Ramakrishna Mission, Belur Math, a Registered Organisation under Societies Registration Act (XXI of 1860) vide registration no. 1917/3, having its registered office at Ramakrishna Mission, Belur Math, P.O: Belur Math, Dt: Howrah, West Bengal 711 202, hereinafter called as "RKM VCC", (which expression shall unless excluded by or repugnant to the context means and includes their respective executors, administrators, representatives and assigns) of ONE PART*

AND

VEDANTA FOUNDATION, a company/NGO incorporated under the Bombay Public Trust Act 1951 and having its registered office at Corner of 'E' road, Off Marine Drive, Mumbai - 400002, hereinafter called as "VEDANTA" (which expressions shall unless excluded by or repugnant to the context mean and include its successors and assigns) of the OTHER PART.

Whereas RKM VCC is a non-profit organization which has been working in West Bengal State, India of ONE PART

AND WHEREAS VEDANTA FOUNDATION is a Public Charitable Trust registered under the Bombay Public Trust Act, 1950 and is keen to support "Underprivileged Youth" for 5 years (hereinafter referred to "the project")

1 **SCOPE** – VEDANTA will support the project of Computer Training with RKM VCC to be started from May 2018. The project period will be effective up to May 2023 (5 years).

The computer courses will be of 126 hours duration spanning over 6 months for CCC Plus or as per no of hours as prescribed by NIELIT for other courses namely, DOT NET, CORE JAVA, WEB DESIGNING, PL&SQL and PROGRAMMING THROUGH C LANGUAGE, course duration would be 80 hours having 1 to 2 hour per day session per batch for 5 days a week. The course will be run at a subsidized rate of Rs. 100/- which is charged towards examination and certification fees. In addition, candidates will be subject to NIELIT FEE (Approx. Rs. 650-Rs.1300 depending on the course) if they desire to take the NIELIT (National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology, Govt. of India) certificate. Candidates opting only for VF certificate will be charged Rs. 100/- only. Number of Computer Machines will be increased with the increase of student's intake to a maximum of 10 each for students up to 375-400 per annum. For RKM VCC, there is no limit to the number of Units. RKM VCC may have more than one unit. A trainer will be sponsored for one unit.

Providing the space for such training as per VF's norms, along with furniture and electricity and 8 MBPS Internet connection or any other fast uninterrupted internet connection with the approval of VEDANTA, to be provided by RKM VCC.

Further, upon the discretion of the RKM VCC, a student may appear for internal examination as VEDANTA candidates and be eligible for the respective course certificate.

2.1 This MOU/ Agreement shall be in full force and effect from the Date on which it is signed and will remain in effect unless terminated by either Party in accordance with Clauses 2.2.

2.2 Either Party may terminate this MoU/ Agreement by giving the other Party thirty (30) days prior written notice. However, Termination of this MoU/ Agreement, howsoever caused or occurring shall be without prejudice to any rights or remedies that may have accrued to either Party prior to the date of such termination, and any provisions of the MoU/ Agreement necessary for the exercise of such accrued rights or remedies shall survive expiry or termination of the MoU/ Agreement to the extent so required.



### **3. RIGHT AND OBLIGATIONS OF RKM VCC**

- 1- RKM VCC will endeavor to achieve measurable deliverables at the end of the total project period of 5 years
- 2- RKM VCC will be training the students as per the CCC Plus curriculum of NIELIT or other courses with duration as specified by NIELIT (National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology, Govt. of India.)
- 3- All expenses need to be accounted as per head mentioned in approved budget.
- 4- RKM VCC has to maintain proper accounts and registration records of the students.
- 5- RKM VCC will ensure compliance with all guidelines/rules/laws of statutory authority
- 6- RKM VCC, if already running a computer training centre can also avail this scheme and can augment their existing infrastructure under this scheme.
- 7- RKM VCC will appoint the trainers from among the local eligible candidates
- 8- RKM VCC will fix honorarium in tune with the present condition and as agreed between VEDANTA and RKM VCC.
- 9- RKM VCC will maintain 1:2 Machine : Student ratio.
- 10- RKM VCC will train as far as possible 375-400 students per annum. (The course will be conducted as mentioned by VEDANTA)
- 11- RKM VCC may collect the fees amount from students for the specific course as it deems necessary to cover its administrative costs and can retain the same after remittance of Rs.100/- to designated bank account of VEDANTA FOUNDATION. RKM VCC must also remit any required amount to NIELIT, as may be required for the specific examination and certification, in the manner as may be prescribed.

### **4. RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE VEDANTA**

- 1- VEDANTA officer/representative can make joint visit with RKM VCC representatives to monitor the progress of project with prior intimation.
- 2- VEDANTA will meet RKM VCC periodically to review the progress of project and necessary modification can be made after review of project within approved budget.
- 3- Honorarium will be given by the VEDANTA.
- 4- VEDANTA will provide the computers machines.  
(Computers will be i5 desktop server with 8 GB Ram 1 TB HDD, 19' monitor with thin clients)
- 6- VEDANTA will increase the Computers machines with the increase in number of students.
7. VEDANTA shall support/sponsor annual maintenance costs and licenses for all the computers provided by it.
8. VEDANTA shall provide up to 10 nos. computers to RKM VCC and sponsor the payment of the certified trainer in the Computer courses.

No amendment, modification or change to this MoU/Agreement shall be enforceable unless reduced to writing and agreed to by both the Parties.

#### 10. ASSIGNMENT

This MoU/Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the Parties and their successors and permitted assigns. Neither Party shall assign or novate this MoU/Agreement or any of its rights or obligations hereunder without the prior written consent of the other Party.

11. TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT: Either party may terminate this agreement by giving 30 days written notice.

This agreement will be effective till May 2023 until otherwise terminated as per clauses mentioned above

RKM VCC is free to retain the hardware and software and use it as it deems necessary after the expiry of the MoU.

# Memorandum of Understanding

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is designated to foster a friendly relationship between Principal, Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Centenary College (Autonomous), Rahara, India (RKMVCC) and Director of the Save The Frogs!, USA (STF) through mutual cooperation on International Research project-Title : *"Screening of different natural sources for isolation of different strains of fungal biocontrol agents and their PCR based (ITS1 and ITS2) molecular characterization and testing their potentiality to ecofriendly combat Chytridiomycosis disease (C.O. = Batrachochytrium dendrobatidis) of frogs in West Bengal, India"*. No financial obligations are assumed under this agreement.

Article 1: Joint or cooperative efforts for fruitful running the International Research Project mentioned earlier.

Article 2: Each Institution designates an expert individual to coordinate this program and all endeavors that may derive from it. For this purpose, Head of the Institution, RKMVCC designates Dr. Swapan Kr Ghosh, Associate Professor of Botany, Molecular Mycopathology Lab., Biocontrol Unit, PG Department of Botany, RKMVCC and Director of the STF.

Article 2: Exchange of views related to the Project between them and other experts of the institution they belong.

Article 3: Mutual exchange of students for research, lecture and discussion in their institution.

Article 4: Exchange of technical data and information related to research work.

Article 5: Joint operation for organization of international Seminar related to this topic.

Article 6: Joint research paper or Book or other periodical publication from outcome data of this project.





Article 7: Any issues arising from the interpretation or implementation of this MoU will be settled through consultations between the parties or such other means as they may mutually decide.

Article 8: This MoU is not intended to create any legally binding obligations but rather, is intended to foster genuine and mutually beneficial academic/ research collaboration.

Article 8: This MoU shall enter in force upon signature by both parties and remain in force for a period of five (5) years, unless terminated earlier by either party upon prior notice to other party.

Article 9: Termination of this MoU shall not affect the validity or duration of the project under this MoU that are initiated prior to such termination.

**Memorandum of Understanding**

**ASSAM UNIVERSITY, SILCHAR**

RAMAKRISHNA MISSION VIVEKANANDA CENTENARY COLLEGE, RAHARA (RKMVCC) and ASSAM UNIVERSITY, SILCHAR(AUS) enter into this agreement to facilitate the exchange of students and scholars recognising the educational and cultural exchanges which can be reached between the two institutions.

**About RKMVCC**

RKMVCC is established on 1963, the birth centenary year of Swami Vivekananda . It is run and managed by Ramakrishna Mission. It has five (5) departments i.e. Chemistry (UG & PG), Botany (UG & PG), Physics, Zoology and Mathematics. RKMVCC was accredited by NAAC in 2014 with Grade A. In 2015 West Bengal State University has recognized RKMVCC as the Swami Vivekananda Centre for Multidisciplinary research in Basic Sciences and Social Sciences. In 2016 UGC has conferred the status of College with Potential for Excellence (CPE). Recently UGC has conferred RKMVCC the status of Autonomous College and the first session of the Autonomous status was started on and from 2017-18. Recently on 03-04-2017 MHRD, Govt. of India has announced the NIRF ranking where RKMVCC is placed 78th ranking in India.

**About AUS**

Assam University came into existence through Assam (Central) University Act, 1989(Established under an Act of Parliament) . It was established in 1994,since then the University is steadily becoming an excellent centre of learning.The campus, situated in Dargakona, about 20 kms from Silchar, is set amid sprawling hillocks, a typical landscape in the North East. The campus in an area of 600 acres surrounded by lakes and mountains provides an ideal environment for academic pursuit. Drawing its 300 plus faculty from many disciplines, from all over the country, the university sustains a multidisciplinary approach to higher education. The University has Sixteen Schools on major disciplines. There are Forty One Departments under these Sixteen Schools. on 03-04-2017 MHRD, Govt. of India has announced the NIRF ranking where this university is placed 92th ranking in India.



## **1. Definitions**

- i) For the purposes of this agreement "home" institution shall mean the institution at which a student intends to graduate, and "host" institution shall mean the institution which has agreed to accept the student from the home institution.
- ii) Semester or academic year shall normally refer to the period relevant to the host institution.
- iii) "Faculty" shall represent the appropriate academic entity at the respective institutions.

## **2. Purpose of the Agreement**

- i) The general purpose of this agreement is to establish specific educational relations and cooperation between the two participating institutions in order to promote academic linkages and to enrich the understanding of the culture of the two countries concerned.
- ii) The purpose of exchanges between faculty members is to promote collaborative research, other educational developments, and to further mutual understanding.
- iii) The purpose of each scholar exchange is to enable students to enrol in subjects at the host institution for credit which will be applied towards their degree at their home institution.

## **3. Responsibilities of Participating Institutions and Students**

Each institution shall undertake all those measures as are seen as reasonable to give maximum effect to this exchange programme.

- i) Each institution agrees to accept and enrol exchange students as full-time, "non-degree" students for the duration of their exchange.
- ii) National travel, all costs for room and board and all personal costs (books, local travel, clothing, etc.) in the host country will be the personal responsibility of each student on the exchange.
- iii) Each exchange student will be provided with the same academic resources and support services that are available to all students at the host institution.
- iv) It is the responsibility of each exchange student to obtain official approval from his or her home institution for subjects taken at the host institution.
- v) It is the responsibility of each exchange student to ensure that he obtains a copy of his official statement of results covering the subjects taken during the period of exchange.
- vi) Exchange students will be subject to the rules and procedures as specified by the host institution for the academic period in which the student enrolls. The home institution will be responsible for all matters concerning credit for subjects taken.
- vii) Teachers of both institutions would be exempted from attending regular classes during coursework. They will have to write an assignment in each paper and earn credit through seminars, fieldwork, etc.

## **4. Numbers of Participants**

Subject to the availability of suitable candidates, each institution will send to the other up to 5 students per semester during the period of the agreement.





## **5. Selection and Enrolment of Students**

It is expected that only highly motivated students of above-average academic quality will be selected to participate in an exchange programme. The home institution will screen applications from its student body for exchange after consulting the host institution regarding the availability of seats and its nature. Students, only pursuing Ph.D., are eligible to participate.

Each institution will send the other completed applications for their students at a given date specified by the host institution. The host institution reserves the right of final approval on the admission of a student.

## **6. Financial Responsibilities of Exchange Students**

Exchange students will be financially responsible for:

- travel to and from the host institution
- travel documentation, etc
- books, stationery, etc
- accommodation and living expenses

The home institution shall determine itself that a candidate for exchange has the ability to meet all his financial responsibilities as detailed above.

## **7. Accommodation**

The host institution does not guarantee accommodation on campus for incoming students. However, every effort will be made to assist students to obtain on-campus or off-campus accommodation within a reasonable distance from the campus. It is recognised that on-campus accommodation may not always be possible and students should be made aware of this possibility as soon as possible. Students will also be made aware that they are responsible for all costs associated with accommodation, including utility accounts and rental deposit.

## **8. Faculty Exchanges**

The two institutions agree in principle to the possibility of exchanges by faculty members. The details of such arrangements will be negotiated at the appropriate time and will be governed by the institutional staffing rules and relevant approval processes. The participating institutions shall not be responsible for any private arrangements made by participating staff members concerning exchange of accommodation, vehicles, etc.

## **9. Period of Agreement**

This agreement will come into effect from the date of signature by both parties, and will be valid for an initial period of six (6) years. The agreement will be automatically renewed on thereafter, unless terminated or replaced with a new agreement. The agreement may be modified or terminated by giving six months written notice to the other party.

## **10. Notices**

Any notice or other communication under this agreement shall be given in writing and delivered by hand, sent by post, facsimiled transmission or e-mail.



## 11. Signatures

This agreement constitutes the agreement in principle to proceed and workout more detailed modalities to operationalise the same between the parties. No amendments consent or waiver of terms of this agreement shall bind either party unless in writing and signed by both parties.

## 12. Arbitration

Any dispute arising with regard to any aspect of this MOU shall be settled through mutual consultations by the parties under Arbitration & Conciliation Act, 1996. It shall be settled through Arbitrator appointed by both institutions. The award of the arbitration shall be final, conclusive and binding upon both the parties.

## 13. Miscellaneous

- The details for the efficacious implementation of this Memorandum of Understanding shall be jointly worked out on mutually acceptable terms within the parameters of the policies, rules and regulations of both the institutions.
- The parties of this MOU may, by mutual consent, add, modify, amend, delete, review or revise any term(s) and condition(s) of this agreement.
- The intent and implementation of this memorandum is subject to the policies of the laws of the land.

## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Life Sciences Sector Skill Development Council (LSSSDC), a Not for profit organization, registered under the Societies Registration Act (XXI of 1860) having its registered office at The Mantosh Sondhi Center, 23, Institutional Area, Lodi Road, New Delhi and operating through its head office at 14, Palam Marg, Rear 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, Vasant Vihar, New Delhi -57 on the other part.

### Background

RKMVCC [UGC under Section 2(f) and 12(B)], founded in 1963, is a constitutional unit of Ramakrishna Mission, West Bengal. The college was graded with Grade A by NAAC in 2014. The UGC conferred it the College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) status in 2017, and the status of an Autonomous College. The College is ranked in National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) recognised by the MHRD, Government of India. The college organised various workshops, training programs, outreach programs for rural biotechnology & health care. Ph.D. research programme in addition to regular UG and PG courses in different science subjects. The college houses Swami Vivekananda Research Centre for Multidisciplinary Research in Basic Sciences & Social Sciences for research. Internal Quality

Assurance Cell (IQAC) unit of the college is involved for planning, guiding and monitoring the Quality Assurance (QA) and Quality Enhancement (QE) activities of the colleges. Also, a strong emphasis is placed on developing analytical skills, communication, team building and problem solving skills.

#### LSSSDC

The Life Sciences Sector Skill Development Council (LSSSDC: [www.lsssdc.in](http://www.lsssdc.in)) had been set up as a Govt approved non statutory skill certification body for Life Sciences Sector (Pharma, Bio-pharm, Contract Research), under the aegis of National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC: <http://www.nsdcindia.org>) a Public Private Partnership Company of Govt. of India with primary mandate of catalyzing the skills landscape in India. LSSSDC aims to address the skills shortfalls in the Life Sciences Sector in India. Its remit includes developing national occupational standards (NOS) for the range of job roles in the Life Sciences sector, comprising – Pharmaceuticals, Biotechnology & Clinical Research, advising relevant curriculum and developing qualification framework to support the on-going development of the sector. It further aims to develop training standards and assessment systems to facilitate the increase of skilled workers in this sector.

#### 1. Purpose of this MOU

DBT supported Skill Development Post Graduate Diploma program on "QUALITY ASSURANCE TESTING OF TISSUE CULTURE RAISED PLANTS"

The parties are exploring the possibility of working together in areas of mutual interest and wish to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding ("MoU") to set out the areas of co-operation.

#### 2. Term

This MoU shall commence on the date of signature and shall endure for a period of three years. It may be terminated by either party upon giving no less than three months' notice in writing.

#### 3. Areas of Co-Operation

The parties shall collaborate in the following areas:

##### 3.1 Knowledge sharing:

Work together in sharing knowledge resources in the key area of Life Sciences (Pharmaceutical, Bio-pharmaceutical, contract research). LSSSDC will share information on Life Sciences gathered during course of study conducted by its Knowledge Partner.

##### 3.2 Support in Skilling Activities

RKMVCC will provide support for skill development activities with joint association of LSSSDC.

LSSSDC will facilitate the skilling process within its boundaries of function.

#### 4. Communication

Both parties agree to:-

Communicate regularly via emails.

Meet formally at least every 6 months to review progress

Update their respective Senior Managers/Executive Team quarterly of progress of this MoU



## 5. Status

## Arbitration





## 1. Definitions

- i) For the purposes of this agreement "1<sup>st</sup>" institution shall mean Maulana Abul Kalam Azad Institute of Asian Studies (MAKAIAS), and "2<sup>nd</sup>" institution shall mean Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Centenary College, Rahara (RKMVCC).
- ii) "1<sup>st</sup>" institute shall give all financial help, international deal related to the participation of foreign delegates and some other related matter.

## 3. Responsibilities of Participating Institutions




**Based on our Board review, I am happy to say that it will be our privilege to participate in these programs by funding the scholarship for two boys and two girls.**

**M/s Excel Plant Link PVT.LTD.** a company incorporated under the companies act, 1956 and having its Head office at Plot no.98, Madhusudan Nagar, Saila Nivas, Bhubaneswar - 751001 Hereinafter referred to as EPL (which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof include its successors, assigns and authorized representatives as the party of the **SECOND PART**.

## **PURPOSE OF THE AGREEMENT:**

RKMVCC is desirous to engage an agency to develop a pilot scale commercial production and sale of its tissue culture plants in their College campus at Rahara, for the students of PG diploma in Plant tissue culture.

## **AND WHEREAS**

EPL has agreed to undertake to utilize the facilities of the RKMVCC required for statutory virus indexing, genetic fidelity tests and regulate all quality requirements to produce, grow and sale of its tissue culture plants in the above Tissue culture facility established by RKMVCC campus subject to the terms and conditions hereto appearing

## **TERMS AND CONDITIONS:**

1. EPL will be allowed to keep mother stock of specific cultivar(s) of Banana, Pineapple tissue cultures, grow plant lets of banana / Pineapple/ ornamental foliage. The primary objective of the mission is for the skill development in students in various disciplines of commercial plant tissue culture industry.
2. To make these program self-supportive attempts will be made by EPL to generate sale of tissue culture plants developed at Greenhouses of RKMVCC facility which is approximately 05 Lakhs plants/annum.
3. A royalty amount will be paid as mutually agreed for the each plant sold from the facility of RKMVCC. However EPL will be solely responsible for the sale of all plants from RKMVCC facilities.
4. It is a Joint venture among Academic Organization (RKMVCC) and Commercial Company (EPL) to promote the students for START-UP Programme / income generation scheme.
5. EPL will arrange short training and internship for the students of RKMVCC in their commercial Laboratory to upgrade their skill and efficiency.
6. EPL will try to arrange some job opportunities for the students who have successfully completed the course from RKMVCC.
7. EPL will guide RKMVCC management to establish the required laboratory facilities for testing pathogen detection in various batches of tissue culture plants before dispatch to Farmer's field.
8. EPL will be allowed to produce all stages of tissue culture plantlets hardened plantlets of particular cultivars of banana/Pineapple and cut flower crops for marketing which they may sell by themselves by paying the appropriate royalty for each plant produced and sold by them. EPL will sell all the plants produced by them and the royalty will be paid on the number of plants sold. EPL will pay royalty on the basis of number of





- plants sold from the facility. The capacity the facility has been estimated at 0.5 million plantlets per annum including all fruits and ornamental cut flower plants put together.
9. RKMVCC will help EPL in the matter related to the labour, power, water and other matters associated with the production of tissue culture plants. In our draft we had written as follows: RKM will take care of all legal formalities connected to the labour, power supply, water and other matters associated with the production of tissue culture plants and EPL will no way be responsible for any consequence arising out of such default.
10. Any other facility that is created and equipments installed by EPL at their cost will be allowed to be removed from the campus after the completion of the agreement period.
11. In case the agreement has to be terminated due to the non-compliance of the terms and conditions by M/s EPL, RKMVCC will take up appropriate action on its own for the termination of the agreement after assigning the proper reasons.

#### **COVERAGE AND VALIDITY:**

- 1.1. This agreement shall be effective for a period of **three years (3 years)** from the above mentioned date and all the terms and conditions contained herein shall apply to all transactions executed between the Parties during this period. The agreement shall be renewable for a further specified period by mutual consent in writing.
- 1.2. RKMVCC and EPL shall review at the end of every year about further applicability of this agreement and the terms and conditions incorporated herein and if required renew the agreement or amend the terms as appropriate in writing by mutual consent of the parties.

#### **FORCE MAJEURE:**

- 1.1. The failure or omission to carry out or to observe any of the terms/provisions or conditions of this MOU during the continuance of an event of Force Majeure, as hereunder defined, or its effects, shall not give rise to any claim by either party against each other or be deemed to be a breach of this MOU if the same is caused by or arises out of Force Majeure.
- 1.2. To the extent that the event is not within the control of the party whose performance under this MOU is affected, provided that the party so prevented from performance shall notify the other party of the cause and resume performance as soon as it is able to do so. The term Force Majeure, as used in this MOU, shall include, but is not limited to the following events like - War, hostilities, acts of public enemy or belligerents, sabotage, blockade, revolution, insurrection, riot or disorder, expropriation, requisition, confiscation, interference by or restrictions or

onerous regulations imposed by Civil or Military or any other Authority, whether legal or defect, whether purporting to act under some constitution, decree, law or otherwise, acts of God, fire, earthquake, storm, lightning, epidemic, quarantine, explosions, accidents by fire or otherwise, or other events whether or not of the same class or kind as those set forth.

- 1.3. The party affected by Force Majeure shall, within seven days of the occurrence / commitment of such circumstances inform the other party by e-mail and telex/cable/fax about the existence of such circumstances and in the event of termination of these circumstances, information shall similarly be given.
- 1.4. A declaration issued by the State Chamber of Commerce supported by a documentary proof shall be sufficient proof of the existence of the above circumstances and their duration, provided that such certificate has not been procured. The occurrence and existence of any of the terms stipulated above shall not be considered as a waiver of obligation of either party under this MOU and each party shall promptly recommence fulfilling its obligation under the MOU as soon as the Force Majeure circumstances cease. However, the duration of this MOU shall stand extended by a period equal to the period of time during which Force Majeure is invoked.
- 1.5. It is expressly agreed that this clause shall not however deprive the parties of any rights or remedies otherwise available in law.

#### **ASSIGNMENT:**

Neither party shall without prior written consent of the other party assign, transfer, charge or deal in any other manner with this agreement or its rights under it or party of it, or purport to do any of the same, nor sub-contract any or all of its obligations under this agreement.

#### **CONFIDENTIALITY**

As part of our joint work together, RKMVCC undertakes to maintain all Confidential Information of EPL and its partners in strict confidence using at least the same degree of care as used in protecting its own confidential information. For the purpose of this Agreement, "Confidential Information" shall mean any written or oral, tangible or intangible, information and data whether owned by EPL or a third party obtained through a confidential arrangement, including but not limited to manufacturing techniques, technical knowhow, marketing, sales, national and international operations, business and financial information.






## ARBITRATION:

Any dispute arising out of or in connection with this agreement including any question on its existence, interpretation, modification, validity or termination shall be referred to and finally resolved by arbitration by and in accordance with the Indian Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 through a single arbitrator to be appointed by Principal of RKMVCC and Managing Director of EPL. The fees of the sole arbitrator and other expenses would be borne by both the parties in equal shares.





## MERCHANT SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Merchant Services Agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into at \_\_\_\_\_ on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2019 ("Execution Date") By And Between: **Atom Technologies Limited**, a company incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956, having its registered office at FT Floor, CTS No. 256 & 257, Suren Road, Chakala, Andheri (E), Mumbai - 400 093, India, (hereinafter referred to as "Atom", which expression shall unless repugnant to the subject or context shall mean and include its successors and assigns) of the One Part; And **Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Centenary College** having its registered office at P.O. Rahara, Kolkata - 700118 (hereinafter referred to as the "Merchant", which expression shall unless repugnant to the subject or context shall mean and include its successors and permitted assigns) of the Other Part. (Atom and the Merchant are individually referred to as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties").

### WHEREAS

A. Atom is, inter alia, engaged in the business of providing multiple payment facilities over multiple channels such as Internet, IVR and Mobile using credit/debit card, net banking, loyalty, prepaid cards, wallets, IMPS, POS and other payment related services/solutions.

B. Merchant is engaged in the business of Education and has requested Atom, and Atom has agreed to provide its payment related services more specifically mentioned in **Schedule I** hereto, on the Merchant's platform in order to enable Customers to purchase the products of the Merchant and/or avail the services provided by the Merchant.

NOW THEREFORE it is acknowledged by and agreed between the Parties hereto as follows:

### 1. DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATIONS

**Definitions:** In addition to the terms defined in the introduction to this Agreement and other parts of this Agreement, wherever used in this Agreement, unless repugnant to the meaning or context thereof, the following expressions shall have the meanings set forth below:

(1) **Affiliate:** in case of a Party being a body corporate, any entity that directly or indirectly controls, is controlled by, or is under the common control of that Party; (2) **Authentication:** shall mean the process by which Customer identification is authenticated in the Processing Mechanism; (3) **Card Association(s):** Card Association(s) shall mean any of VISA, MasterCard, NPCI, Amex, or any other card association as may be specified by Atom from time to time. (4) **Chargeback:** shall mean a transaction that refers to the reversal of any transaction on account of (i) any alleged forgery of the card or other details (ii) any charge/debit made on a card that has been listed as a hot listed card or otherwise listed on the card association warning bulletins (iii) duplicate processing of the Transaction, (iv) any amount required to be refunded due to, denial of Transaction by the Customer as wrongly charged payment/ extra payments and/or due to the fraudulent use/service related/quality related/misuse of the personal and financial information of the Customer by any unauthorized person; and (v) subject to applicable law, any other dispute received from bank/ card association or circumstance that may result in the existence of a claim for reversal of any

transaction as determined reasonably by Atom; (5) **Confidential Information:** shall mean any and all information or data of a confidential nature, application, network configuration, documents, software, accounts, business plans and processes and/or any other information in whole or in part of either Party; (6) **Customer:** shall mean any person who is availing services or products of the Merchant using Atom Services; (7) **Fees:** shall mean such fee that has been agreed between the Parties payable by the Merchant to Atom for Atom Services, and as detailed in **Schedule I** hereto; (8) **Guidelines:** shall mean the Card Association, Bank or Policy Guidelines on Issuance and Operation of Pre-paid Payment Instruments in India, issued by Reserve Bank of India; (9) **Payment Channels:** shall mean Internet, IVR, Mobile, Point of sale or any other channel where electronic payments are accepted using credit/debit card, net banking, loyalty, prepaid cards, wallets, IMPS or any other payment instrument (10) **Payment Gateway:** shall mean the protocol that may be stipulated by or through Atom to enable the Authentication of Customers and the Authorization of payments in accordance with the Processing Mechanism; (11) **Payment Gateway Network:** shall mean the hardware, software and telecommunications tools necessary to perform protocol conversion between different networks or applications and all associated software required for the Merchant to submit Authorization and data capture transactions to Atom and to transmit Authorization and settlement transactions between the Merchant and the Payment Service Provider(s); (12) **Payment Modes:** shall mean payment via credit cards, debit cards, pre-paid wallets/cards, net banking, Mobile payments, IMPS, EMI, or any other payment mode as applicable. (13) **Processing Mechanism:** shall mean the mechanism utilizing the Payment Channels of the Payment Service Providers through Atom Services and/or through such other modes and mechanisms of payment, as may be notified by Atom from time to time; (14) **Payment Gateway Providers:** shall mean banks, financial institutions and any other person authorized to issue or process payments or any persons acting on their behalf. (15) **Payment Service Provider(s):** shall mean Payment Gateway Providers and Atom; (16) **MSP Model:** shall mean the services to be provided by Atom to the Merchant wherein

code/merchant identification number' is obtained by Atom and the charges and settlement process is the responsibility of Atom subject to clause 5 herein below. (17) **Non-MSP Model:** shall mean the services to be provided by Atom to the Merchant wherein the 'merchant code/merchant identification number' is obtained by the Merchant directly from the bank and the charges and settlement process is solely the responsibility of the bank. (18) **Transaction:** shall mean a financial transaction conducted by the Customer using Atom Services.

### 2. SCOPE OF THE AGREEMENT:

2.1 Atom has developed technologies, processes and software which enables the end-user/Merchant to make/accept payments vide the respective Payment Channels through any of the Payment Modes under the MSP/Non-MSP Models (hereinafter referred to as the "Atom Services") as outlined in **Schedule I** hereto.

2.2 If any new Payment Channel(s) /Payment Mode(s) under MSP/Non-MSP Model(s) is/are available with Atom at a later date, which is/are beyond the scope of services as provided in **Schedule I** and if the Merchant requests Atom to provide such additional services, then the Parties shall negotiate in good faith with respect to the terms, conditions, and compensation for such additional services. Any agreement for such additional services shall be set forth in writing and considered as an addendum to this Agreement.

### 3. ATOM SERVICES:

3.1 During the subsistence of this Agreement with the Merchant, Atom agrees to permit the Merchant to use the Atom Services as listed in **Schedule I**, and which may be amended from time to time at the discretion of Atom by providing written notice to the Merchant.

3.2 The Atom Services facilitate payments made by Customers through any of the Payment Modes under the respective Payment Channels made available by Atom, and provide technological and payments support in relation to Transactions involving the Payment Mechanism compliant with requirements of Payment Service Provider(s) so as to enable receipt of such payments by the Merchant or any person acting on the Merchant's behalf.

3.3 The Merchant hereby agrees to the installation of certain software and hardware solutions to integrate the Merchant's billing system with

Atom Services as part of this Agreement.

3.4 On the date of installation of Atom Services, the Merchant shall be deemed to have accepted the Atom Services.

3.5 The Merchant agrees and acknowledges that in processing the Transactions, Atom shall be entitled to rely upon all electronic communications, orders or messages sent to Atom through the Processing Mechanism and Atom shall not be obligated to verify or make further inquiry into the identity of the sender, or the message integrity, of any communications, orders or messages. The Merchant shall under no circumstances dispute such reliance by Atom. Atom shall not be bound by or obligated to act, on any electronic communications, orders or messages received on-line, from the Merchant or the Customer, which do not properly utilize the security measures, as may be applicable from time to time.

3.6 As and when Atom requests for a particular document, bills/invoices, proof of delivery or any other supporting documents, the same shall be handed over to Atom within four (04) days of the request. If on account of non-compliance, Atom incurs any loss, the same shall be made good by the Merchant, inclusive of all charges, interest and costs. Atom with or without intimation shall be entitled at any times to disclose any and all information concerning the Agreement and transactions of the Merchant, within the knowledge and possession of Atom to any Regulator RBI, Card Associations or law enforcement, in connection with any card facility provided.

3.7 Nothing in this Agreement shall prohibit Atom from providing services similar to those provided under this Agreement to others, including competitors of the Merchant.

3.8 The Atom Services are provided on an "as is" basis, and the Merchant may terminate this Agreement in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement upon any dissatisfaction, shortfall or deficiency in the Atom Services, and Atom shall have no liability to any person under law or equity for such termination or deficiencies under claim.

### 3.9 ESCROW ACCOUNT [APPLICABLE FOR PREPAID ACCEPTANCE]:

IT IS EXPRESSLY AGREED AND CONFIRMED THAT THE AMOUNT LYING IN THE ESCROW ACCOUNT OF ('KOTAK MAHINDRA BANK LTD') IS CHARGED UNTO THE HOLDERS OF THE PREPAID PAYMENT INSTRUMENTS AND THE





MERCHANT ESTABLISHMENTS TO PAY THE DUES ARISING OUT OF USAGE OF THE PREPAID PAYMENT INSTRUMENTS OR OTHERWISE PROVIDED FURTHER, THAT THE AMOUNT IN THE ESCROW ACCOUNT SHALL BE DEEMED TO BE A SECURITY CHARGED UNTO THE PARTICIPATING MERCHANT ESTABLISHMENTS OR HOLDERS OF THE PREPAID PAYMENT INSTRUMENTS ISSUED BY THE ISSUER AND TO BE UTILISED TO REDEEM THE DUES ARISING OUT OF USAGE OF THE SAID PREPAID PAYMENT INSTRUMENTS IN THE FIRST INSTANCE OR OTHERWISE TO BE PAID TO THE HOLDERS OF THE SAME ON SURRENDER OF THE INSTRUMENT AND SETTLEMENT OF THE DUES IN THE EVENT OF THE SCHEME BEING WOUND UP OR BEING DIRECTED BY THE RESERVE BANK OF INDIA TO BE DISCONTINUED AS PROVIDED FOR IN THE OPERATIVE GUIDELINES ISSUED BY THE RESERVE BANK ON APRIL 27, 2009 ON ISSUANCE AND OPERATION OF PRE-PAID PAYMENT INSTRUMENTS, AS AMENDED FROM TIME TO TIME AND/OR OTHERWISE IN EVENT OF BANKRUPTCY, LIQUIDATION, WINDING UP, OF ATOM.

3.10 The Merchant agrees that any charges accepted by Merchant, which prove to be uncollectable, shall be the exclusive financial responsibility of the Merchant alone. The Merchant agrees to such charges or the Chargeback of such uncollectable charges (as the case may be) by Atom, without any demer or protest. The Merchant acknowledges that Atom is entitled to exercise its right to set off a lien on the credit value in the account of the Merchant or the unsettled transactions in the pipeline in the event of failure by the Merchant in providing necessary valid proof of transaction to the retrieval request / Chargeback / suspicious Transaction received from the issuer through the card schemes (VISA / MasterCard / MFC / Amex).

#### 4. FEES FOR ATOM SERVICES

4.1 The Merchant agrees to pay to Atom, the fees and charges ("Fees") as stipulated in Schedule I attached hereto this Agreement, along with any other sums including but not limited to, reimbursable expenses for the implementation of the Atom Services, and any and all applicable statutory taxes, including without limitation, service tax.

4.2 Atom shall have the right to vary the fees specified in this clause, if in any time after the Execution Date.

#### 5. CHARGES AND SETTLEMENT OF ACCOUNTS

5.1 The transfer of the Customer's payment to the Merchant by Atom under the MSP Model of the Atom Services shall be governed by the following terms:

a) Subject to applicable law, payments shall be made available by Atom to the Merchant after making the following adjustments: deduction of any other deductions in terms of this Agreement from the amount of the Transaction (subject to the limits

volumes/limits allowed to the Merchant):

(i) the consideration/fees, the TDR along with other dues, fees, charges, out of pocket expenses, etc., due to Atom in terms of Schedule I of this Agreement or at any other rates and percentage as amended from time to time for all Transactions processed;

(ii) the sum of all customer charges denied, refused, or charged back by the customer/partner banks;

(iii) all costs, charges, expenses, etc., of whatsoever nature on account of, inquiries, disputes, cancellations and/or refunds processed on account of Merchant's customer charges and/or chargeback; (refunds, chargeback recovery shall be done at gross amount. If any convenience fees is applicable or exchange rate fluctuations the same shall be borne by the Merchant)

(iv) any taxes, including but not limited to, service tax, education cess, as may be applicable, penalties, charges or other items, reimbursable under any of the provisions of this Agreement, or otherwise, occurring in any manner whatsoever.

b) Atom shall reconcile the accounts and make payments to the Merchant subject to the right of Atom to withhold payments of the amount arrived at, for any charges of chargeback recovery/debits that may be fraudulently incurred/suspicious transactions or for any reason whatsoever either in terms of this Agreement or otherwise to the extent as permissible under applicable law. Atom shall release such payments withheld for any charges/debits fraudulently incurred once determined at Atom's sole discretion that such charge/debit is in fact a valid charge and Atom shall not be liable for any penalty/interest on account of the same. Merchant shall indemnify Atom of any losses suffered by Atom in the event that Atom is unable to withhold payment in respect of suspected fraudulent charge/debit, provided however that Atom shall be entitled to set-off any such claims against the security deposit or to otherwise require the Merchant to make corresponding payments to Atom not later than two (02) days from the date of the Merchant being notified.

c) The Parties hereby agree and acknowledge that, irrespective of any payment made by Atom to the Merchant, the same shall be made without prejudice to any claims, or rights, that Atom may have, against the Merchant and such payments shall not constitute any admission by Atom, as to the performance by the Merchant of its obligations, under this Agreement and the amount payable to the Merchant.

5.2 If deemed necessary by Atom, the Merchant shall provide such further assurance/guarantee to security as may be required to set off claims against, against the

security deposit, in the event of (i) any material breach of the terms of this Agreement (ii) Atom is unable to withhold payment in respect of suspected fraudulent charge/debit or (iii) due to the existence of any other claims against the Merchant, or by Atom including without limitation as described in clause 5.4 hereto.

5.3 Time of making payments/due date of payment: Upon completion of the Transaction and the receipt of funds by Atom, and where applicable, on receipt of proof of delivery of the dispatch of the relevant product and/or services of the Merchant, Atom shall deliver payments to the Merchant, to the later of: (i) two (02) business days from the date of receipt of funds from the banks or financial institutions (ii) the maximum period of time for the making of payments by Atom as specified under extant regulations from time to time.

5.4 The making of payments under this Agreement by Atom to the Merchant, due to Atom being unable to exercise set-offs against amounts due to Atom, shall not constitute a waiver of its rights to recover amounts payable by the Merchant to Atom and seek indemnities from the Merchant for losses suffered by Atom for claims permissible under applicable law or for any reason, including but not limited to:

a) Any Transaction is for any reason unlawful or unenforceable.  
b) Any information presented electronically to Atom in respect of the Transaction is not received in accordance with Atom's requirements as specified from time to time.

c) Any Transaction made outside the territory authorized for the use of such instrument.

d) Transaction which is posted more than once to cardholder's account.

e) Transaction which is doubtful or erroneously paid for, to the Merchant. Atom reserves the right to discontinue, with the provision of the Atom Services and recover such amounts from the Merchant and be indemnified in relation to any losses in connection thereto.

#### 6. CHARGEBACK AND OTHER DUES

6.1 Atom shall be entitled and Merchant hereby authorizes Atom to debit to the account of the Merchant, from time to time, to recover any amounts due from it or incurred by Atom on account of the following:

(i) Chargeback of Transactions, or  
(ii) Any penalties, charges/fees, consequential loss or claims including but not limited to legal claims that may be made against Atom by Payment Service Providers, Customers or regulatory authorities for any other reason than a breach of this Agreement by Atom. These amounts shall include without limitation any costs arising as a result of excessive Chargeback of Transactions, or failure of Transactions, or disputes.

7. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

#### 7. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

7.1 Atom represents and warrants that: (i) it is duly organized and validly existing and is duly qualified, including for undertaking the transaction contemplated by this Agreement, as per the laws of India and the jurisdiction where it maintains its principal or registered office; and

(ii) it has all the requisite power, including corporate power and authority to enter into this Agreement, to perform its obligations thereunder and to consummate the transaction contemplated hereby.

7.2 Merchant represents, warrants and covenants that:

(i) it has full capacity, power and authority to enter into this Agreement and has already taken and will continue to take all necessary and further actions, (including where applicable without limitation obtaining of all governmental and other necessary approvals / consents / licenses in all applicable jurisdictions) and to authorize the execution, delivery and performance of this Agreement.

(ii) it shall not use the Atom Services in any manner, or in furtherance of any activity, which constitutes a violation of any law or regulation or which may result in fraud on any person or which may cause Atom to be subject to investigation, prosecution or legal action.

(iii) it shall disclose its privacy policy on the website and ensure that Merchant conducts its business in accordance with the same;

(iv) it shall take all such precautions as may be feasible or as may be directed by Atom to ensure that there is no breach of security and that the integrity of the link between Merchant's website, Payment Gateway, PIS and the Payment Mechanism is maintained at all times. Merchant shall ensure that all Customers upon accessing the link are truly and properly directed to the Payment Gateway;

(v) it shall not describe itself as an agent or representative of Atom;

(vi) Atom shall not be a party to any agreement(s), assurance(s) or undertaking(s) between the Customer and Merchant in any manner whatsoever.

(vii) it shall use the Atom Services only for Merchant's website(s), PIS and product/service categories approved by Atom under this Agreement and for no other sites, products or services. If Merchant wishes to use the Atom Services for any other website/product or service, Merchant shall obtain prior written approval from Atom for the same; and it shall at all times during the subsistence of this Agreement observe and comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations in each applicable jurisdiction.

#### 8. TERM AND TERMINATION



8.1 This Agreement shall be effective as of the Effective Date and shall remain in force for a period of one (01) year thereafter (the "Initial Term"). The Initial Term shall automatically be renewed and shall extend for successive twelve (12) month terms (each a "Renewal Term" and all such Renewal Terms together with the Initial Term, the "Term"), commencing at the conclusion of the Initial Term or any Renewal Term, unless either Party gives the other written notice at least 60 days prior to the conclusion of the Initial Term or the then current Renewal Term, as the case may be, that the Agreement will not be renewed, failing which the Agreement shall be deemed renewed automatically.

8.2 This Agreement may be terminated by either Party by giving sixty (60) days prior notice in writing to the other without being required to assign or give any reasons.

8.3 Either Party shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement in case of the defaulting Party's failure to remedy the breach of any terms and conditions of the Agreement within thirty (30) days of receipt of written notice stating such breach.

8.4 Atom reserves the right to terminate the Agreement immediately without any notice period in case of fraud, or if the Merchant has violated any of the terms of the Agreement. In such cases all fees/charges paid by merchant shall be forfeited.

8.5 Further Merchant acknowledges that it shall honour all Transactions until the Agreement is in force. The Merchant shall provide necessary documentation related to Transactions done by Merchant post termination upto a period of fifteen (15) months in case of Customer disputes, failing which the Merchant will indemnify Atom towards such Transaction loss.

#### 9. CONFIDENTIALITY:

Each Party acknowledges and agrees that in connection with this Agreement, the receiving Party shall not disclose to any Third Party any Confidential Information of the disclosing Party that it may have access to during and in connection with its performance of services hereunder. Merchant shall ensure that neither the Merchant nor any of its employees are privy to any information relating to Customer details and information relating to passwords/pins and other private matters in respect of the Atom Services. Merchant shall not reverse engineer, decompile or disassemble any software shared/disclosed by Atom. Each party acknowledges that monetary damages may not be a sufficient remedy for unauthorized disclosure of any Confidential Information / materials and that the disclosing party shall be entitled, without waiving any other rights or remedies, to such injunctive or

equitable relief as may be deemed proper.

#### 10. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY:

10.1 Merchant acknowledges and agrees that Atom owns or has the right to use all the intellectual property incorporated in the software and associated with the Atom Services. This Agreement does not grant the Merchant any rights to, or in, patents, copyrights, trade secrets, trade names, trademarks (whether registered or unregistered), or any other rights or licenses in respect of the software or in relation to the Atom Services, other than as specified in this Agreement.

10.2 Merchant shall not copy, modify, duplicate, create derivative works from, frame, mirror, republish, display, transmit, or distribute, all or any portion of the software in any form or media, or by any means, attempt to reverse compile, disassemble, reverse engineer or otherwise, reduce to human-perceivable form, all or any part of the software.

10.3 Merchant shall not access any part of the software, in order to build a product or service which competes with the software or the businesses of Atom.

#### 11. INDEMNIFICATION:

11.1 Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement the Merchant hereby undertakes and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Atom and its directors, affiliates, representative, employees and agents against all actions, proceedings, claims, liabilities (including statutory liabilities), penalties, demands and costs (including without limitation, legal costs of Atom on a solicitor / attorney and own client basis), awards, damages, losses and/or expenses however arising directly or indirectly as a result of:

(i) any claim or proceeding brought by the Customer or any other person against Atom, in respect of any services offered by the Merchant;

(ii) any gross negligent act of Merchant's agents, employees, licensees or Customers;

(iii) any fines, penalties or interest imposed directly or indirectly on Atom on account of Merchant's services or Transactions conducted through Merchant under this Agreement; and

(iv) breach of any of terms and conditions of this Agreement by the Merchant, its agents, employees or representatives.

#### 12. NO WARRANTY:

12.1 Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement, Atom disclaims all warranties, express or implied, written or oral, including, but not limited to, warranties of fitness for a particular purpose with respect to the Atom Services. The Agreement, made as regards the Atom Services, shall be limited to an Merchant acknowledges that Atom Services may not be

'uninterrupted' or 'error free'. The Merchant also acknowledges that the services provided by the Payment Gateway Providers to Atom which is passed on to the Merchant under this Agreement, can be in any event brought to an abrupt end in any event whatsoever by Atom and/or the Payment Gateway Providers, for any reason whatsoever and in such an event the Atom Services to the Merchant will in turn be terminated without Atom having to be given any reason whatsoever.

12.2 Atom's sole obligation and the Merchant's sole and exclusive remedy in the event of interruption to the Atom Services or loss of use and/or access to Atom's website and the Payment Gateway Provider's Processing Mechanism and services, shall be, to use all reasonable endeavors to restore the Atom Services and/or access to the Processing Mechanism as soon as reasonably possible.

12.3 Without prejudice to any other provision of this Agreement, Atom does not warrant that:

(a) the Atom Services, and the Payment Gateway Provider's Processing Mechanism will be provided 'uninterrupted' or 'free from any errors'; or

(b) the Atom Services are free from any virus, Trojan or other malicious, destructive or corrupting code, program or macro.

12.4 Atom reserves the right to make changes, enhancements, and/or modifications, due to mandatory, or regulatory or periodic requirements, applicable to the Atom Services from time to time in such manner as it may deem necessary or appropriate for the provision of the Atom Services by providing notice to the Merchant of the same. Merchant agrees to comply with the directions and/or instructions issued by Atom to suitably modify/upgrade the Merchant's systems to comply with the standards of the Processing Mechanisms (then in force) and the standards applicable to the Atom Services. If so requested by the Merchant, Atom shall provide such additional services to the Merchant to suitably modify/upgrade the Merchant's systems and the Merchant agrees to pay Atom such additional charges as Atom deems fit in this regard.

#### 13. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY:

13.1 In no event shall either Party be liable, whether in contract or in tort or otherwise for special, punitive, indirect or consequential damages, including without limitation, loss of profits or revenue arising under or in connection with this Agreement.

13.2 Notwithstanding any other term of this Agreement or any damages that may be incurred by the Merchant for any reason whatsoever, the entire liability of Atom under this Agreement, shall be limited to an amount not exceeding the fees received from the Merchant for the

Atom Services for the month immediately preceding the date of such proven claim/demands.

#### 14. NON-SOLICITATION:

Merchant agrees that during the term of this Agreement and for a period of two (2) years thereafter, it shall not, without the prior written approval of Atom hire or enter into a contract with any employee, agent or representative of Atom to provide services to the Merchant or, directly or indirectly, induce or attempt to induce or otherwise counsel, discuss, advise or encourage any employee, consultant, agent or representative of Atom to leave or otherwise terminate such person's relationship with Atom.

#### 15. APPLICATION OF THE BANK AGREEMENT:

Atom has entered into a definitive agreement with the Bank ("Bank Agreement") in connection with and to facilitate the provision of the Atom Services set out herein. The relevant portion of the Bank Agreement is attached herewith this Agreement as Schedule II. Merchant acknowledges the terms of the Bank Agreement and further explicitly agrees that the terms of the Bank Agreement will apply back to back to the Merchant, as if, it were a party thereto in place of Atom. All liabilities and obligations set out in the Bank Agreement shall be deemed to be liabilities and obligations of the Merchant. Merchant shall hold harmless and indemnify Atom against any claims that may arise from the Bank Agreement.

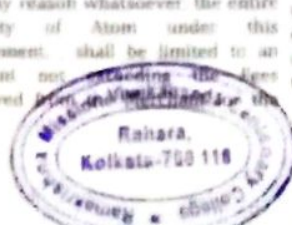
#### 16. BANNED PRODUCTS & SERVICES:

#### 17. MISCELLANEOUS:

##### 17.1 Entire Agreement:

This Agreement with all its Schedules comprise the final understanding of the Parties relating to the subject matter hereof and cancels all prior discussion or agreements, whether written or oral, between the Parties. Any modification of or amendment to this Agreement, shall be effective upon a notification to the Merchant by email, or any other mode of communication as agreed between the Parties.





**17.2 Severability:**

If any provision of this Agreement is determined to be unenforceable in whole or in part thereof for any reason, then such provision or part thereof shall to that extent be deemed deleted from this Agreement and the legality, validity and enforceability of the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall not be in any way be affected thereby and any act of omission/commission of the Parties hereto done prior to the provisions being held unenforceable shall be deemed to be valid and/or binding on the other.

**17.3 Assignment:**

This Agreement will bind the successors and permitted assigns of the Parties hereto and the Merchant will obtain prior consent from Atom before assignment of this Agreement. The rights under this Agreement granted to the Merchant are not assignable or transferable without the prior approval of Atom. Atom shall be entitled to assign or transfer its rights and obligations under this Agreement to any other entity.

**17.4 Rights, Remedies and Waiver:**

All rights and remedies hereunder shall be cumulative and may be exercised singularly or concurrently. If either Party fails to perform its obligations under any provision of this Agreement and if the other Party does not enforce such provision then, failure to enforce on that occasion shall not prevent enforcement on later occasions.

**17.5 Governing Law, Jurisdiction and Dispute Resolution:**

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws in India. The Parties agree to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts located in Mumbai, India as regards any claims or matters arising under or in relation to the terms and conditions of this Agreement. Any notice or notification in connection with this Agreement shall be in writing and any notice or other written communication pursuant hereto shall be signed by the Party issuing the same and shall be addressed to Atom or the Merchant at their respective addresses mentioned hereinabove or to such other address as the concerned Party may inform the other Party in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement.

## SCHEDULE II RELATIVE CLAUSE FROM THE BANK AGREEMENT

## **3. Responsibilities of Participating Institutions**

- ii) "1<sup>st</sup> " institute shall give the help related to the cooperation with the foreign institutes working for the same goal.
- iii) "1<sup>st</sup> " institute shall give the help related to collaboration with foreign Universities and higher educational institutes in the said objectives.
- iv) "2<sup>nd</sup> " shall take the responsibility of arrangement of all seminar, conference and workshop by providing infra-structure and event management team in India.
- v) "2<sup>nd</sup> " shall take the responsibility of pre-conference arrangement like invitation of the paper presenters, resource persons and delegates of all seminar, conference and workshop in respect of academic institutions in India.
- vi) "2<sup>nd</sup> " shall take the responsibility of pre-conference arrangement like printing brochure, posting the same to all academic institutions, arrangement of the seminar kits, arrangement of refreshments and other related activities of participants in seminar, conference and workshop in India.

## **4. Numbers of Participants**

Subject to the availability of suitable candidates, "2<sup>nd</sup> " institution will finalize the number after consulting the "1<sup>st</sup> " institution during the period of the agreement.

# **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

**BETWEEN**

**Plant Biotechnology Lab, Department of Botany, RAMAKRISHNA MISSION VIVEKANANDA CENTENARY COLLEGE, RAHARA, KOLKATA- 700118**

**Department of Botany, EAST CALCUTTA GIRLS' COLLEGE, LAKE TOWN, LAKE TOWN, KOLKATA-700089**

This Agreement is entered into on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of December 2019 by and between Plant Biotechnology Lab, Department of Botany, Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Centenary College (PB-BOT, RKMVCC), Rahara, Kolkata- 700118, and Department of Botany, East Calcutta Girls' College, Lake Town, Lake Town, Kolkata-700089 (hereinafter called DB, ECGC).

## **1. OBJECTIVES OF THE MOU**

The objective of this Memorandum of Understanding is:

- a. To promote and enhance scientific and academic cooperation and interaction between PB-BOT, RKMVCC and DB, ECGC in mutually beneficial research areas.
- b. To provide a formal basis for initiating interaction between PB-BOT, RKMVCC and DB, ECGC.

## **2. PROPOSED MODES OF COLLABORATION**

PB-BOT, RKMVCC and DB, ECGC propose to collaborate through the following:

- a. Cooperation and promotion of research and development and publication in areas of mutual interest.
- b. Formulation of joint research proposals and participation in joint research programs.
- c. Visits by faculty, students and researchers to each other's organization, for initiating and implementing joint projects on mutually agreed terms.
- d. Organize of joint of Seminars / Workshops in areas of mutual interest.
- e. Any other interaction related to research and development cooperation in areas of mutual interest.

## **3. STUDENT RELATED MATTERS.**





- a. Students of PB-BOT, RKMVCC may avail research facilities at DB, ECGC which is sole decided by the DB, ECGC depending upon the availability and its nature. However, travel, boarding and lodging costs will be borne by the participating students of PB-BOT, RKMVCC.
- b. Likewise students of DB, ECGC may avail research facilities at PB-BOT, RKMVCC which is sole decided by the DB, ECGC depending upon the availability and its nature. However, travel, boarding and lodging costs will be borne by the participating students of DB, ECGC.
- c. While carrying out studies / research work at DB, ECGC, students of PB-BOT, RKMVCC will be governed as per DB, ECGC Rules and Regulations.
- d. Likewise students of DB, ECGC will be governed by Rules and Regulations of PB-BOT, RKMVCC while carrying out studies / research at PB-BOT, RKMVCC.

#### **4. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS**

- a. Each party shall not make any public announcement or statement or publish or release any information or use logo of the other party in relation to any proposed collaboration without the prior written approval of both the parties. Each party shall keep confidential any information that receives from other party marked confidential.
- b. All intellectual property solely conceived and/or developed by DB, ECGC during this agreement shall be owned by DB, ECGC. All intellectual property solely conceived and/or developed by PB-BOT, RKMVCC during this agreement shall be owned by PB-BOT, RKMVCC. Intellectual Property jointly conceived and/or developed by DB, ECGC and PB-BOT, RKMVCC will be jointly owned by DB, ECGC and PB-BOT, RKMVCC. Each party may use such property for research and scholarly purposes.

#### **5. AGREEMENTS FOR COLLABORATION**

The themes of joint activities / collaboration, conditions of utilizing the results achieved arrangements for specific visits and other forms of cooperation will be developed mutually for each specific case with appropriate written agreements where necessary. The signing of this agreement does not entail any financial obligation for either party.

Whilst the purpose of this MOU is to outline an academic and management framework between the two parties, designed to promote research cooperation in both institutions, the parties do not intend to be legally bound to each other, and this Agreement does not impose legal obligations on either party.

#### **6. JOINT MANAGER AND WORKING PARTIES**



Each party will appoint one person to act as the Joint Managers of this Agreement. **Dr. Sk. Moquammel Haque**, Assistant Professor, Department of Botany, East Calcutta Girls' College will act as the Joint Manager for DB, ECGC and **Dr. Biswajit Ghosh**, Programme Coordinator, Associate Professor, Department of Botany will act as the Joint Manager for PB-BOT, RKMVCC.

(The Joint Managers may nominate appropriate personnel to manage the details of the particular activities or programmes taken up under this Agreement)

## **7. SELECTION AND ENROLMENT OF STUDENTS**

It is expected that only highly motivated students of above-average academic quality will be selected to participate in an exchange programme. The home institution will screen applications from its student body for exchange after consulting the host institution regarding the availability of seats and its nature. Students, only pursuing M.Sc. & Ph.D., are eligible to participate.

Each institution will send the other completed applications for their students at a given date specified by the host institution. The host institution reserves the right of final approval on the admission of a student.

## **8. TERM AND TERMINATION**

This Agreement will be effective upon signature of the respective authorities of both parties for a period of five years, at which time it will be reviewed for possible renewal for a further five year period.

The Joint managers may by mutual agreement at any time and subject to written ratification by the appropriate authorities of each party, modify the activities and the arrangements undertaken under this Agreement.

Either party may, on six months notice in writing, terminate this Agreement in advance of its normal expiration or request the renegotiation of its conditions. Under normal circumstances, staff or students who have commenced an activity under this Agreement should be allowed to complete the activity, under the conditions applying when notice was given.

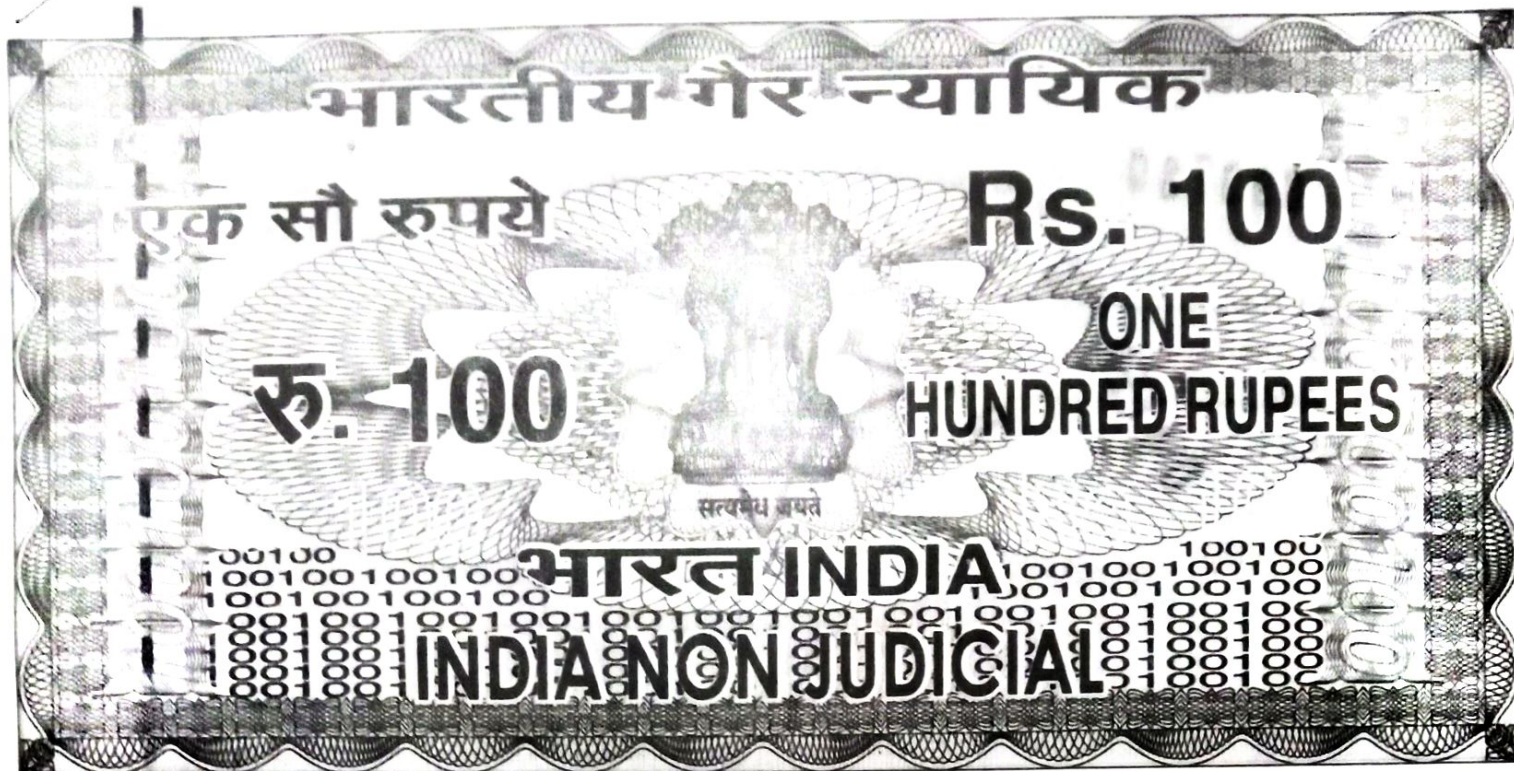

**Preamble**

Institute of Nano Science and Technology (INST), Mohali is an autonomous research institute under Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India. INST is involved multidisciplinary research related to nanoscience and nanotechnology. The institute aims to develop nanomaterials and create new fundamental understandings in nanoscience. INST is also promised towards outreach activities for creating broader societal impact in the field of education and research.

Ramakrishna Mission (RKM) is a well-known organization for global and local social activities. An integral part of this initiative is higher education. Three major educational organization of prime repute under the umbrella of RKM are:



(i) Ramakrishna Mission Residential College (RKMRC), Narendrapur (ii) Ramakrishna Mission Vidyamandira (RKMV), Belur and (iii) Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Centenary College (RKMVCC), Rahara. These three institutes have a common goal of providing education to students from all sections of the society including financially weaker sections.

RKMRC is a residential and autonomous college affiliated to the University of Calcutta. Recognized by the UGC as a College with Potential for Excellence (CPE), the college offers courses in undergraduate and postgraduate levels in varied subjects of sciences and humanities as well as research courses in some science subjects.

RKMV is a residential and autonomous college affiliated to the University of Calcutta. Recognized by the UGC as a College with Potential for Excellence (CPE), the college offers courses in undergraduate and postgraduate levels as well as research courses in varied subjects of sciences and humanities.

RKMVCC is an autonomous college affiliated to the West Bengal State University. Accredited by NAAC with Grade A and recognized by the UGC as a College with Potential for Excellence (CPE), the college offers courses in undergraduate and postgraduate levels as well as research courses in varied subjects of sciences and humanities.

As a part of the outreach activity initiative, INST and the three educational institutes viz. RKMRC, RKMV, and RKMVCC have agreed to initiate a special internship program. The primary objective is to give exposure to postgraduate and final year undergraduate students of RKMRC, RKMV and RKMVCC in the cutting edge field research of Nano Science and Nanotechnology through a two month internship program. The relationship also aims to create a joint outreach program wherein INST shall add the educational initiative to the societal programs of the three organizations of RKM. This document presents a general framework for such a relationship. It also includes some specifically identified areas of cooperation, which may be updated from time to time.

### **Coordination**

Director, INST shall be the Coordinator from INST and the Principals from RKMRC, RKMV and RKMVCC shall be the Coordinator from their respective organizations. The participants and Coordinators may change from time to time as decided by appropriate authority of the respective institutions.

### **Scope of Cooperation**

(i) A two month internship program will be provided by INST to the postgraduate and under graduate students of RKMRC, RKMV and RKMVCC. These students shall have specialization in any of the following subjects : Physics, Chemistry,



Biology, Microbiology, Polymer Chemistry, Industrial Chemistry, Applied Chemistry, Material Sciences and Nanoscience.

(ii) The program will be conducted once in a year between 1<sup>st</sup> of March to 30<sup>th</sup> of April each year.

(iii) Maximum total number of students to intern each year will be 12. Out of these 12 students a maximum of 2 undergraduate level students will be allowed to intern. The rest students should be from postgraduate level.

(iv) The local hospitality of the aforementioned interning students will be funded by INST.

(v) The to and fro travel of the students from their parent institute to INST shall be respectively supported by their institutes.

(vi) At least two postgraduate students each from Physics (any specialization), Chemistry/Applied Chemistry (any specialization) and Biology/Microbiology should intern under this program each year.

(vii) Each year INST together with any of three institutes: RKMRC, RKMV and RKMVCC will organize a two day outreach program.

The areas of cooperation may be revised by mutual consent. However, specific programs may require separate agreements detailed out and documented as annexures to this MoU.

### **Code of Conduct**

Visiting student and faculty will abide by the codes of conduct of the host Institution.

### **Intellectual Property**

Any major finding arising during the internship program shall remain the intellectual property of INST, Mohali.

### **Legal Status**

This document is a statement of intent to foster genuine and mutually beneficial cooperation and is not legally binding on both the parties. Any disputes shall be resolved through mutual discussion.

### **Validity and Termination**

This MoU is valid for an initial period of five years and becomes effective from the date it is signed by the partners. The partnership period may be extended by mutual consent.

This agreement may be terminated

- a. on either party giving the other party 6 months' prior written notice;
- b. on written notice by one of the Parties if the other Party has committed a breach of this MoU.



However, specific commitments made prior to such intimation shall be honoured by both the partners including ensuring that any student at that time participating in the program is able to complete the term of the assignment and be assessed for it.



This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as MoU) is made on this 29<sup>th</sup> day of the month of November in the year ...2021 by and between the **ICAR-Central Institute for Subtropical Horticulture**, Rehmankhera, Lucknow (Name of the ICAR Institute) having its Head Office at Lucknow. [hereinafter called "**CISH**"/First party], a constituent Research Institution of the Indian Council of Agricultural Research, Krishi Bhavan, New Delhi-110 001 on the ONE PART and the **Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Centenary College**, (An autonomous college), Rahara, Kolkata- 700118, W.B.... [Name of the AU/ICAR-DU (Within NARS) or Central/State Govt./Public Sector Funded Institution/State University/Autonomous Body/Private University or Institution having its headquarters at Rahara [hereinafter called "**RKMVCC**"/Second party] on the OTHER PART (who for the purpose of this MoU are hereinafter collectively referred to as the parties).

The parties, having discussed fields of common research interests and allied activities between the two institutions, have decided to enter into long-term collaboration for promotion of students' training and quality postgraduate research in cutting edge areas in accordance with the provisions contained in the Guidelines issued vide Letter No. 2-8/2012- HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or as revised from time to time.

WHEREAS the "First Party" ICAR-Central Institute for Subtropical Horticulture, Lucknow AND WHEREAS the "Second Party", Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Centenary College, (An autonomous college)

AND WHEREAS it has been considered expedient to agree in writing to participate jointly in the projects requiring expertise and logistics from both the parties.

**Article 1. Scope**

1.1 The objective of Mou is promotion of inter-institutional research collaboration, staff and students' training and post graduate research in cutting edge areas by facilitating scientist, staff and students to seek specialized guidance and facilities of both the institutes



1.2 The Second party will recognize the First party as an Institute for conducting research related to the thesis requirement of the research students for Master's (M.Sc. Biotechnology, M.Sc. Biochemistry, M.Sc. Microbiology, M.Sc. Zoology, M.Sc. Botany) and Doctorate. The Second party will recognize Scientists of the ICAR Institute as recommended by its Director in accordance with the University rules and regulations for guiding students working for the said degree.

1.3 Operational details of research effort and collaboration will be made in common research programmes and/or projects restricted to specific mandated domain within the approved disciplines/divisions. The objective(s) for research work for a student coming from a Second party outside NARS should be exclusively different as far as possible.

1.4 Research instrumentation facility and library facilities available with the First party and the Second party will be made available to the faculty and research scholars. However, the costs of specific consumables will be borne by the respective organizations.

1.5 There shall be an exchange of students for academic, research and training purposes. Accommodation in the Hostel shall be arranged, wherever possible, as per extant rates. The duration of exchange visits will be determined by mutual consent between both the parties.

#### Article 2. Management

2.1 Director of the First party and the Vice-Chancellor/Head of the Institution of the Second party will be responsible to work out operational details of co-operation between the two organizations and ensure proper and effective implementation of this MoU.

2.2 The Advisory Committee will meet at least once in a year alternatively in the institutions of the First party and the Second party to review the activities. This meeting shall include presentation on the academic and research activities, which should be open to the students, faculty and scientists.

#### Article 3. Exchange of Information

3.1 The term "information" includes scientific or technical data, results and/or methods of investigation, and other information intended to be provided, exchanged, or arising under project descriptions entered into pursuant to this MoU.

3.2 The parties support the widest possible dissemination of information. Each party in joint projects shall be given the right to use, disclose, publish or disseminate such information for any and all purposes.

#### Article 4. General Provisions

4.1. It is understood that the First party and the Second party subscribe to the principle of equal opportunity and do not discriminate on the basis of

*Jan*



race, sex, age, caste or religion. Both the Institutions shall abide by these principles in the administration of this agreement and neither party shall impose criteria for exchange of scholars or students, which violate principles of non-discrimination.

4.2. Both parties understand that all financial agreements will have to be negotiated separately and will depend on the availability of funds.

4.3 Both parties acknowledge that exchange of students from one party to the other shall be subject to the availability of funds and shall comply with the regulations and policies of the First party and the Second party.

4.4 Any research publications arising will be jointly published in accordance with the provisions laid out in Item 3.2.1C of the Guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programme as trainees at ICAR institutions as notified vide Letter No. 2- 8/2012-HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or revised guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time.

4.7 A copy of the thesis/dissertation will be submitted to the First Party after the award of the degree by the Second party.

4.8 All questions related to this MoU arising during its term will be settled by the parties by mutual agreement. Disagreements at the operating level shall be forwarded to respective higher officials for appropriate resolution failing which an arbitrator of mutual acceptance may be identified for the settlement of dispute, if any.\

4.9 All questions not foreseen related to this MoU will be handled by the parties by mutual agreement.

4.10 Nothing in this MoU is intended to affect other cooperation or collaborations between the parties.

4.11. The objective (s) of the research work for a student coming from such an institution should be exclusively different as far as possible.

4.12 RA/ SRFs. Who have completed their course work and working under different research projects in an institute may be permitted to join a degree programme only with a university recognized by UGC/ICAR-AU system bilateral MoU on IPR issues. However, PI of the project with the approval of Director may have to issue a certificate that the regular research work of the projects will not be hampered on account of joining of RA/ SRF for the degree programme. The RA/ SRF will not avail leave for completing the research work for the degree.

4.13. The partnering institute(s) would be expected to make reasonable contribution in the form of intellectual input to the student's research problem and may not merely serve as source of providing samples / facilities for the study.



4.14 The efforts will be for conservation of animal cultures (bacteria, fungi or viruses) isolated in the study by deposition to the National Centre of Veterinary types cultures.

#### Article 5. Intellectual Property Rights

5.1 The Second party will be expected to ensure protection of the Intellectual Property Rights generated or likely to be generated during the student's research work. The ICAR as the first applicant (for its institute) and the Second party shall be the joint applicants for IPRs and the students and involved scientific staff shall be included as the inventor/breeder/author. The 'ICAR Guidelines for Intellectual Property Management and Technology Transfer/Commercialization' as amended from time to time shall be the reference for exploitation of the generated intellectual property, whose management and benefits sharing shall be mutually decided in each case.

5.2 The IPR shall rest with institution where the major part of the research work was carried out by the student. In the event of equal amount of work being carried out at both the AU/DU and ICAR institute, patents / protections/ knowledge generated will be shared in proportion as per the "ICAR Guidelines" for intellectual property management and technology transfer / commercialization" as amended from time to time.

#### Article 6. Admission and Fees

6.1 All those who wish to register as trainees or for Master/Doctoral programme under this MoU must apply for admission at the Second party. The allocation of Major Guide/Advisor would be finalized before the registration and will be governed by the provisions laid out in Items 3.2.1A and 3.2.2A of the Guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programmes as trainees at ICAR institutions as notified vide Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or revised Guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time, for the students from within NARS and outside NARS, respectively.

6.2 Admission of the students and the award of degrees for different programmes will be the responsibility of the Second party as per the rules and regulations.

6.3 Allotment of the students at the First party will be done by the approval of Director of the First party and Vice-Chancellor/Head of the Institution of the Second party.

6.4 The First party would have the right to screen the student's eligibility for admission based on their academic period.

6.5 The PME Cell of the First party in consultation with the representative of the Second party shall decide the location and sharing quantum of research work.

6.6 The number of student(s) at any particular time will be subjected to the availability of research facilities and scientists' time to guide thesis research at the First party institution.

6.7 Any student(s) admitted to the First party for training/postgraduate research, if found violating the rules and regulations laid down by the First party or indulge in such activities that amount to tarnishing the image of the Institute, or cause damage to the property, the registration of such student(s) would be summarily terminated. The Second party will not complete the formalities of issuing the certificates to such students until they compensate the losses to the First party.

6.8 Fees will be charged from the students by the First party as per Guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programmes as trainees at ICAR institutions vide Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or revised Guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time. No fee may be charged by the First party from the students registered with AU/DU within NARS. However a student registered with a Second party, outside NARS, will deposit fee of Rs. 10,000/- for training duration of 3 months (not leading to a degree/dissertation) and Rs. 30,000/- per semester (six months) for training, research, dissertation exceeding three months. Any change in fee structure by ICAR will be applicable from the date of revision and shall be charged by the First party.

#### Article 7. Entry into effect, modification and termination

7.1 This MoU shall become effective on the date it is signed by the parties and shall be valid for three years extendable up to five years. Both parties shall review the status of the MoU at the end of each three/five year period to determine any modification, whenever necessary. The period of validity of this MoU may be extended by mutual consent up to five years. This MoU may be amended by mutual written agreement and may be terminated at any time by either party upon written notification signed by the competent authority of the party initiating termination. Such notification must be given to the other party at least six months in advance from the effective date of termination.

7.2 All joint activities not completed at the expiration or termination of the MoU may be continued until their completion under the terms of this MoU.

7.3 No amendment or modification of the MoU shall be valid unless the same is made in writing by both the parties or their authorized representatives and specifically stating the same to be amendment of the MoU. The modifications/changes shall become part of the MoU and shall


